Dear Mr. Marshall:

I refer to our letter dated June 30, 2016, regarding the release of certain Department of State material under the Freedom of Information Act (the "FOIA"), 5 U.S.C. § 552.

Our review is ongoing, and we have determined that 92 additional documents may be released in full, 263 may be released with excisions, and 21 must be withheld in full. All released material is enclosed.

An enclosure explains the FOIA exemptions and other grounds for withholding material. Where we have made excisions, the applicable exemptions are marked on each document. All non-exempt material that is reasonably segregable from the exempt material has been released. For the documents withheld in full, we have cited FOIA Exemptions 5 and 6, 5 U.S.C. §§552 (b)(5) and (b)(6).

We will keep you informed as your case progresses. If you have any questions, your attorney may contact Trial Attorney, Caroline Anderson, at (202) 305-8645 or Caroline.J.Anderson@usdoj.gov. Please refer to the case number shown above in all correspondence about this case.

Perspective on USAID Contracting Mechanisms
May 2008

USAID's indefinite quantity contracts and other large-scale contracting mechanisms were designed to make the country's bi-lateral assistance more efficient, resulting in more and better delivery of development aid to the world's poor. As an implementing partner on several of these awards, FINCA International thinks that the benefits of multiple layers of contracted assistance rarely materialize. In FINCA's experience prime contractors (a) pass very little funding to their implementing partners, (b) greatly increase the cost to the taxpayer through 'reselling' the industry's technical expertise at high mark ups, and/or (c) provide unclear instructions to the organization actually implementing the program on the ground regarding goals or compliance procedures. FINCA's experiences with direct awards from USAID missions have proven to be much more successful.

With respect to point A, as a specialized organization, FINCA is unable to compete as a prime for these multi-disciplinary awards. As a result, FINCA (like many other specialized agencies) joins a larger team as a sub-contractor, helping the prime demonstrate to USAID that they have assembled a team of implementing partners with the skill and expertise to deliver. However, after the prime wins the award, FINCA often finds that the primes have little interest in utilizing the mechanism to fund sub-contractor activities. While USAID generally makes multi-million dollar awards, FINCA's sub-awards rarely exceed \$100,000.

There is little transparency within consortia and very little information is readily available from USAID, so it is difficult for FINCA to state unequivocally how much money prime contractors receive, how much they spend on their own overhead and profit, and how much they pass to sub-contractors, but FINCA's experience includes:

- **Haiti:** In 2006, USAID Haiti issued a task order under the AMAP MF IQC to support Haiti's microfinance, small and medium enterprise sector. DAI won the award in the amount of \$6-8 million. DAI sub-contracted a total of \$1.2 million. FINCA received \$85,000
- **Uganda:** In 2002, FINCA signed a sub-award with Chemonics as part of the USAID-funded SPEED project to facilitate the transformation of FINCA Uganda. While the sub-award to FINCA was for \$600,000, the procurement process was so restrictive, that FINCA was only able to receive \$325,000. FINCA believes that the total award to Chemonics was \$30 million.
- **Armenia / Georgia / Mexico / Ecuador:** There are certainly more examples, but over the last six to eight years, Chemonics and DAI received sizable awards to support micro-enterprise in these markets. Though running the largest or one of the largest MFIs in each of these countries, FINCA International has received no sub-award funding through these mechanisms.

As a result of their failure to secure funding through the IQC system, a coalition of practitioners (FINCA among them) raised concerns about the system to USAID. USAID replied that given limited staffing they could not manage contracts with individual micro-finance institutions (MFIs) and suggested that the coalition organize itself and find a leader to bid against the big contractors. In preparing to bid on the Leaders with Associates Award (LWA), the industry followed USAID's advice, selecting AED to serve as the prime since none of the MFIs had the capacity to manage such a large contract. The ARIES funding for Afghanistan was channeled through the LWA mechanism. Unfortunately, although FINCA has received significant funding for its program in Afghanistan, AED's limited industry expertise created another reporting layer between USAID and the MFIs while providing little technical value to the MFIs or USAID when things got tough in Afghanistan.

With respect to point B, senior FINCA staff who have been hired away by large consulting firms to provide technical assistance to FINCA and other MFIs at a much higher cost to the US Government include Phil Broughton (hired by Chemonics but who has returned to FINCA because of its more productive environment), Mark Rostal (hired by DAI) and Adam Blanco (also hired by DAI). At best, this practice duplicates the talent required for a project (FINCA must replace these employees). At worst, as contractors lose or reassign these individuals a lack of continuity constantly hinders forward progress. In addition, much of the technical assistance provided by contractors – despite the quality of the people they have hired – has been overly broad and not valuable to the organization's needs.

With respect to point C, FINCA has on numerous occasions found it difficult to obtain instructions directly from the local Mission or from AID in Washington, and dialogue with the prime contractor has in many cases been conspicuously influenced by self-interest or based on lack of understanding or attention to the goals/outcomes sought by USAID. We believe that this process is exacerbated by a proclivity to use the grant to hire as many consultants as possible, resulting in a short term outlook and a diminution of funds available to achieve the desired outcomes. FINCA believes that direct dialogue and reporting with AID can ensure a common understanding of goals and an effective resolution of issues that arise in the course of a project.

When contracting directly with USAID missions, FINCA has found substantially more success. In 2004, FINCA received an award for \$1.2 million from the USAID mission in Kinshasa to launch a new program in the DR Congo. FINCA earlier had received direct awards from USAID missions for programs in Kyrgyzstan (\$6.2 million) and Azerbaijan (\$4 million). These programs are today among FINCA's most successful affiliates. Together they account for nearly 210,000 clients and a \$120 million loan portfolio.

Analysis/Conclusion

The contractors that win the bulk of the awards from USAID have very different success criteria than organizations such as FINCA. While FINCA measures success in terms of

the ability to deliver sustainable financial services that have a long-term impact on development, most contractors are project focused, seeking to demonstrate short-term results.

Oversight has often been inconsistent or lacking in understanding of the programs. FINCA is committed to full compliance with the letter and spirit of regulations. Intervention by prime contractors with no on-the-ground involvement is often ineffective or even counterproductive.

In FINCA's experience, contractors fail to engage with organizations like FINCA and, often impede our efforts (as well as do a disservice to taxpayers) by attempting to cure their lack of expertise by hiring away FINCA's talent to manage the new contracts and provide technical assistance.

FINCA and many other MFIs have decades of experience working with USAID, managing contracts and producing results. FINCA does not need expensive consultants to help account for money and write reports. Ultimately, the US Government would be better served by making direct contracting relationships between organizations such as FINCA and USAID the rule, rather than the exception.

Taunton state Sen. Marc Pacheco 'flattered' to be mentioned by Portuguese newspaper as possible candidate

TAUNTON — The next U.S. ambassador to Portugal might have a Portuguese surname.

Diário de Notícias, a Portuguese daily newspaper, reported earlier this week that state Sen. Marc Pacheco, D-Taunton, could be the future U.S. ambassador in Lisbon.

The Association of Friendship Between Portugal and the U.S. is going to send representatives to speak with the new Obama administration, with the goal that the next U.S. ambassador be Luso-American, a cultural group that includes people of Portuguese descent.

Members of the Association of Friendship Between Portugal and the U.S. will be traveling in mid-December to promote the Taunton senator through "some contacts with influential people in Washington," according to the organization's secretary, Paulo Nogueês.

Pacheco — who spoke last month in Portugal at an association conference on the importance of Portugal's relations with its communities in the U.S. — said he is honored the group has considered him.

"I am not asking, not putting my name forward ... I am flattered," said Pacheco. "All of this is very premature."

"I am certainly willing to be considered at the appropriate time. This is very early in the process. The Obama-Biden administration is just now looking at the major cabinet positions," added Pacheco.

The president of the association and the former Portuguese secretary of external commerce, Antonio Neto da Silva, said the relationship between Portugal and the U.S. would be bolstered if a U.S. ambassador had Portuguese roots.

"This is a unique opportunity that we cannot let go by," said Silva. "We believe that he has the characteristics and is the right person at the right time."

Pacheco "is a Democrat and the president-elect is a Democrat. He has close ties to the Clinton family, and there is a high probability that the Senator (Hillary Clinton) could be the next secretary of state," added Silva.

Pacheco has been a supporter of the Clintons since 1991 and campaigned for Hillary Clinton in the presidential Democratic primary.

He met several times with Biden and, after the primaries during a dinner for key financial supporters of Hillary Clinton, Pacheco briefly met Obama.

In the general election, Pacheco campaigned for Obama in New Hampshire and Pennsylvania. The Sunday before the election, he traveled with President Bill Clinton through New Hampshire.

Meanwhile, Pacheco is on the road again. This week he traveled to Austria to receive the 2008 Sustainable Future Award from the Austrian European Biomass Association, for his work in environmental policy.

Desde Frank Carlucci, que Henry Kissinger despachou para Lisboa após o 25 de Abril, preocupado com as manifestações de punho no ar, todos os embaixadores dos EUA em Portugal têm sido os chamados "embaixadores políticos". Quando Ronald Reagan tomou posse também foi avançado o nome de outro sócio do PT, Richard Aldrich, membro da família Rockefeller e que teria adorado representar o seu país em Lisboa.

Na administração Bill Clinton, falou-se no antigo congressista Tony Coelho, que chegou a estar indigitado para chefe de gabinete da Casa Branca, mas os republicanos não lhe deram descanso e preferiu deixar a vida pública.

Desta vez, a notícia chega de Lisboa, via O Jornal, de Fall River: o Diário de Notícias informa que o senador estadual de Massachusetts Marc Pacheco poderá ser o futuro embaixador dos Estados Unidos.

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TAUNTON - The next U.S. ambassador to Portugal might just have a Portuguese last name.

Diario de Notícias, a Portuguese daily newspaper, reported earlier this week that Massachusetts State Senator Marc Pacheco could be the future U.S. ambassador in Lisbon.

The Association of Friendship Between Portugal and the U.S. (AAPEUA) is going to send representatives to speak with the new Obama Administration, with the goal that the next U.S. ambassador be Luso-American.

Members from AAPEUA - a civil society organization established a year after 9/11 that promotes cooperation between both countries was - will be traveling in mid-December to promote the Taunton Senator through "some contacts with influential people in Washington," according to the organization's secretary Paulo Nogueês.

Pacheco - who delivered a speech last month in Portugal in an AAPEUA conference on the importance of the relations between Portugal with its communities in the U.S - is honored that the association has considered him.

"I am not asking, not putting my name forward... I am flattered," said Sen. Pacheco. "All of this is very premature."

"I am certainly willing to be considered at the appropriate time. This is very early in the process. The Obama-Biden administration is just now looking at the major cabinet positions," added Pacheco.

The president of AAPEUA and former Portuguese Secretary of External Commerce, Antonio Neto da Silva, believes the relationship between Portugal and the U.S would be greatly increased if a U.S. ambassador had Portuguese roots.

"This is an unique opportunity that we cannot let go by," said Silva. "We believe that he has the

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characteristics and is the right person at the right time."

"He is a democrat and the president-elect is a de-mocrat. He has close ties to the Clinton family, and there is a high probability that the Senator (Hillary Clinton) could be the next Secretary of State," he added.

Silva wants to see a "paradigm shift" in social, economic and cultural relations between the countries. Although the association is appreciative of the work done by past ambassadors, to Silva they have been "political ambassadors, who have not provided a strong stimulus in promoting an active relation between the countries."

"The economic relationship between the countries is minimal and that does not make sense... you need to fight so that relationship can grow," said Silva. "The State Senator is a an experienced politician. He is a fighter and to develop the relationship between Portugal and the U.S. you need a fighter. It's our understanding that we need an Ambassador with Portuguese blood in his veins."

Silva said that they believe that the Obama Administration would support Pacheco as the next ambassador and that the likelihood of that happening would increase if Sen. Clinton is tapped as the next Secretary of State.

Pacheco has been a supporter of the Clintons since 1991 and campaigned for the Sen. Clinton in the past presidential democratic primary.

He has met several times with Biden and right after the primaries, during a dinner for key financial supporters of Sen. Clinton, he briefly met Obama.

In the general election, State Senator Pacheco campaigned for Obama in New Hampshire and in Pennsylvania. The Sunday before the election, he traveled with President Bill Clinton through New Hampshire.

Meanwhile, Pacheco is on the road again. This week he traveled to Austria to receive the 2008 Sustainable Future Award from the Austrian European Biomass Association, for his work in environmental policy.

In Boston, Pacheco's counterpart in the House, Rep. Antonio F.D. Cabral was surprised with the news. He has worked closely with Pacheco passing legislation regarding East-Timor.

"From time to time these things get discussed. To have someone who knows Portugal well in that position would be great and Senator Pacheco fits that description," said Rep. Cabral. "If there is

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any validity to this story then the Portuguese-American community would be excited as well."

Pacheco has been distinguished with the prestigious Order of Prince Henry the Navigator from the Portuguese government and is the highest-ranking Portuguese American politician in Massachusetts.

O movimento para nomeação de Marc R. Pacheco como embaixador dos EUA em Lisboa começou em Janeiro e do certo modo com a pergunta formulada por um repórter do jornal "Boston Gazette", da cidade onde o senador estadual de Massachusetts reside: "Costaria de ser embaixador em Portugal?"

Um sido enviados centenas de cartas para a Casa Branca, nomeadamente da Paulo Pinto, director da agência Massachusetts Alliance of Portuguese Speakers e Frank Baptista, director da Rádio-Voz do Imigrante (WHIT-AM) de Fall River, nas a campanha não se limita a Massachusetts.

O Portuguese Cultural

Center, de Danbury, Connecticut também escreveram para a Casa Branca lembrando, entre outras razões, que "esta a nomeação do senador Pacheco para embaixador dos EUA em Portugal, a administração Obama não se escolherá uma pessoa qualificada, mas também fará história nomeando o primeiro luso-americano para tal cargo".

Já houve embaixadores luso-americanos em Roma, de origem brasileira em Paris e origem irlandesa em Dublin.

Portanto, é tempo de Lisboa ter também um embaixador luso-americano. É o reconhecimento da importância da comunidade luso-americana e uma homenagem ao seu país de origem.

A campanha merece a adesão dos luso-americanos e dos portugueses radicados nos EUA, como tal também do Portuguese Times, recomendando a nomeação de Marc Pacheco para a embaixador em Lisboa.

Thank you for this wonderful award, Claudine. You have been a committed supporter of Val-Kill from the very beginning when you claimed this humble cottage above all of America's Treasures. Your passion and hard work have never flagged and remain essential to preserving this important slice of our Nation's history.

Thank you, Carol, for hosting such a terrific event. Your work throughout the years on behalf of Val-Kill and Save America's Treasures inspires us all. I am grateful for your support.

I'm delighted to be joined by my friend Bobbie Greene McCarthy. As many of you know, Bobbie was my Deputy Chief of Staff in the White House and she helped create the Save America's Treasures program. Her years of service in the government and non-profit sectors reflect her commitment to sustaining and enlivening the democratic ideals that America stands for. Bobbie, thank you for all you do.

And I want to thank Senator Gillibrand for those generous remarks and for her support of Val-Kill. Senator, your steadfast work on so many issues that New Yorkers care about – from healthcare to the environment to children's issues – helps the people of this great State and our nation make progress in fulfilling their own dreams as citizens.

I am also honored to stand alongside Laura Roosevelt and Rabbi Joshua Boettiger [Bah-di-ger]. Your grandparents would be proud of everything you have achieved and the paths you have taken.

Most of all, thank you to the board members and to all of the volunteers – many of whom are with us. You have worked long and hard over the last ten years to make Val-Kill the outstanding historic site and educational center it is today. It is a personal pleasure to be with all of you who care about Val-Kill and the importance of keeping the legacy of Eleanor Roosevelt alive. I don't know that any human being could truly keep up with Eleanor Roosevelt, but I am honored to receive the “Following in Her Footsteps” Award and I will keep trying to honor her work and her legacy as well as I can. For many years now, I have been aware of the breadth and scope of her footsteps. Everywhere I go, it seems, Eleanor Roosevelt had already been there, championing her causes and standing up for human rights.

It is fitting that we gather today at the United Nations. On December 10, 1948 the U.N. General Assembly adopted the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. As United States Representative to the U. N. Commission on Human Rights, Eleanor Roosevelt labored – often at Val-Kill – to craft large portions of the Declaration, the first international agreement on the rights of humankind.

The Declaration took shape in a world ravaged by fascism, and all of the evils that accompanied the second World War. From the moment the Nazis came to power, they proceeded, through laws and propaganda, to decimate the mentally ill, the sick, gypsies, homosexuals, and Jews.

Since the birth of the Declaration we have, as a global community, expanded the circle of human dignity to reflect human rights. Many countries that have emerged in the last 60 years have drawn inspiration from the Declaration in writing their own constitutions. The power of this Declaration inspired the establishment of a high commissioner on Human Rights at the UN Conference on Human Rights in 1993. And in 1995 at the UN's Fourth World Conference on Women, the Declaration's simple power gave voice to the ideal that "human rights are women's rights, and women's rights are human rights."

Since the Declaration's adoption, we have made progress that Eleanor Roosevelt would acknowledge and appreciate. And yet, in spite of our best efforts, we still have not expanded the circle of human dignity far enough.

We must do more to improve the status of women and girls, the poor, those who are hungry and unhealthy. We must lend our voices in support of those living under oppressive regimes, or being silenced and subjugated for expressing their ideas or beliefs. And this is why, at the State Department, we are again following in Eleanor Roosevelt's footsteps and making sure that human rights are a central component of our foreign policy.

The status of women and girls is a key indicator of whether or not progress is possible in a society. We simply cannot solve the global problems confronting us – from a worldwide financial crisis to the risks of climate change, from chronic hunger to disease and poverty – when half the world's population is left behind. The rights of women are at the core of these challenges, and human rights will always be central to our foreign policy.

As part of that commitment, we announced last month the creation in the State Department of the Office of Global Women's Issues, which will coordinate foreign policy issues and activities relating to the political, economic and social advancement of women around the world. It will mobilize concrete support for women's rights, especially political and economic empowerment. The State Department will be at the forefront of this global challenge through initiatives and programs designed to increase women's and girls' access to education and health care, to combat violence against women and girls, and to ensure that women's rights are indeed viewed as human rights.

This new office gives us the capacity to make progress on improving the status of women around the world. Melanne Verveer, who serves as Ambassador-at-Large, will be leading this effort. Most of you know Melanne, who was my White House chief of staff and, until I stole her away, the person who led Vital Voices from its earliest days as a Clinton Administration initiative, created in the wake of the Beijing Women's Conference to help empower women around the world politically, economically, legally and socially, and to advance women's equality and global progress.

This is a moment of great challenge for our nation, but also great possibility. Lining the halls and the walls of my offices in Foggy Bottom are portraits of our Secretaries of State. They remind me of the footsteps I follow – and all of us follow – in the work we do every day. Long before a woman was appointed Secretary of State, Eleanor Roosevelt helped lay the groundwork for a new and higher standard of human conduct and diplomacy, and a call to respect the rights and dignity of all people.

It is an honor and a privilege to follow in her footsteps. Thank you, again, for this wonderful award and for helping to preserve the home that Eleanor Roosevelt loved, and for doing so much to keep her alive in our hearts and minds.

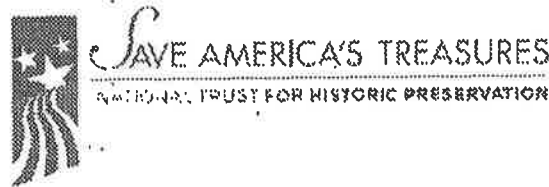

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Thank you, Carol, for hosting such a terrific event. Your work throughout the years on behalf of Val-Kill and Save America's Treasures inspires us all. I am grateful for your support.

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And I want to thank Senator Gillibrand for those generous remarks and for her support of Val-Kill. Senator, your steadfast work on so many issues that New Yorkers care about – from healthcare to the environment to children's issues – helps the people of this great State and our nation make progress in fulfilling their own dreams as citizens.

I am also honored to stand alongside Laura Roosevelt and Rabbi Joshua Boettiger [Bah-di-ger]. Your grandparents would be proud of everything you have achieved and the paths you have taken.

Most of all, thank you to the board members and to all of the volunteers – many of whom are with us. You have worked long and hard over the last ten years to make Val-Kill the outstanding historic site and educational center it is today. It is a personal pleasure to be with all of you who care about Val-Kill and the importance of keeping the legacy of Eleanor Roosevelt alive. I don't know that any human being could truly keep up with Eleanor Roosevelt, but I am honored to receive the “Following in Her Footsteps” Award and I will keep trying to honor her work and her legacy as well as I can. For many years now, I have been aware of the breadth and scope of her footsteps. Everywhere I go, it seems, Eleanor Roosevelt had already been there, championing her causes and standing up for human rights.

It is fitting that we gather today at the United Nations. On December 10, 1948, the UN General Assembly adopted the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. As United States Representative to the UN Commission on Human Rights, Eleanor Roosevelt labored – often at Val-Kill – to craft large portions of the Declaration, the first international agreement on the rights of humankind.

The Declaration took shape in a world ravaged by fascism and all of the evils that accompanied the second World War. From the moment the Nazis came to power, they proceeded, through laws and propaganda, to decimate the mentally ill, the sick, gypsies, homosexuals, and Jews.

Since the birth of the Declaration we have, as a global community, expanded the circle of human dignity to reflect human rights. Many countries that have emerged in the last 60 years have drawn inspiration from the Declaration in writing their own constitutions. The power of this Declaration inspired the establishment of a high commissioner on Human Rights at the UN Conference on Human Rights in 1993. And in 1995 at the UN's Fourth World Conference on Women, the Declaration's simple power gave voice to the ideal that "human rights are women's rights, and women's rights are human rights."

Since the Declaration's adoption, we have made progress that Eleanor Roosevelt would acknowledge and appreciate. And yet, in spite of our best efforts, we still have not expanded the circle of human dignity far enough.

We must do more to improve the status of women and girls, the poor, those who are hungry and unhealthy. We must lend our voices in support of those living under oppressive regimes, or being silenced and subjugated for expressing their ideas or beliefs. And this is why, at the State Department, we are again following in Eleanor Roosevelt's footsteps and making sure that human rights are a central component of our foreign policy.

The status of women and girls is a key indicator of whether or not progress is possible in a society. We simply cannot solve the global problems confronting us – from a worldwide financial crisis to the risks of climate change, from chronic hunger to disease and poverty – when half the world's population is left behind. The rights of women are at the core of these challenges, and human rights will always be central to our foreign policy.

As part of that commitment, we announced last month the creation in the State Department of the Office of Global Women's Issues, which will coordinate foreign policy issues and activities relating to the political, economic, and social advancement of women around the world. It will mobilize concrete support for women's rights, especially political and economic empowerment. The State Department will be at the forefront of this global challenge through initiatives and programs designed to increase women's and girls' access to education and health care, to combat violence against women and girls, and to ensure that women's rights are indeed viewed as human rights.

This new office gives us the capacity to make progress on improving the status of women around the world. Melanne Verveer, who serves as Ambassador-at-Large, will be leading this effort. Most of you know Melanne, who was my White House chief of staff and, until I stole her away, the person who led Vital Voices from its earliest days as a Clinton Administration initiative, created in the wake of the Beijing Women's Conference to help empower women around the world politically, economically, legally, and socially, and to advance women's equality and global progress.

This is a moment of great challenge for our nation, but also great possibility. Lining the halls and the walls of my offices in Foggy Bottom are portraits of our Secretaries of State. They remind me of the footsteps I follow – and all of us follow – in the work we do every day. Long before a woman was appointed Secretary of State, Eleanor Roosevelt helped lay the groundwork for a new and higher standard of human conduct and diplomacy, and a call to respect the rights and dignity of all people.

It is an honor and a privilege to follow in her footsteps. Thank you, again, for this wonderful award and for helping to preserve the home that Eleanor Roosevelt loved, and for doing so much to keep her alive in our hearts and minds.

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Biographic Information for Selected Barnard College Officials

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President Debora Spar

The Barnard College Board of Trustees unanimously approved the appointment of Debora L. Spar as the president of Barnard College effective July 1, 2008.

Professor Spar is the Spangler Family Professor of Business Administration and has been Senior Associate Dean for Faculty Research and Development at Harvard Business School, two roles that made her candidacy particularly compelling for us. In one, she epitomizes the teacher-scholar model that is the linchpin of Barnard's superb faculty. In the other, she has been a stellar administrator who has brought innovative leadership to governance issues. And despite the demands of both she has also devoted herself to the concerns of social justice that are so important to our students; she has served as Chair of the Harvard University Committee on Human Rights and is the creator and Chair of Making Markets Work, a program to develop leaders in both the private and public sector in African nations.

As Senior Associate Dean, Professor Spar was responsible for distributing nearly \$20 million in research funds by working closely with faculty on their project goals and demands. She instituted a fellowship that allows faculty members to live abroad to work on international research, and a program that brings visiting scholars from other countries to Harvard. Professor Spar also developed a new policy on family leave and led the effort to develop a part-time tenure track.

Professor Spar has been awarded the Student Association Faculty Award for Outstanding Teaching and often serves as an advisor for students on research projects. She is the author of dozens of the case studies that are used in Harvard Business School classes. These reflect her expertise in both international affairs and ethical issues, and include "The Pharmaceutical Industry Responds to AIDS," "Union Carbide's Bhopal Plant," and "Nike and International Labor Practices." She frequently acts as a consultant for multinational corporations, government agencies, and non-governmental organizations.

Professor Spar has written four books and co-authored two. Her most recent, *The Baby Business*, was published in 2006 and explored the economic, political and social issues surrounding reproductive technologies. She has appeared on *60 Minutes*, *The Newshour with Jim Lehrer*, *ABC World News Tonight*, and in many newspapers and magazines. Her own articles have appeared in publications ranging from *The New England Journal of Medicine* to *Foreign Affairs* to *The Review of International Political Economy*.

Professor Spar received her doctorate in government from Harvard; her thesis on international commodity cartels was published as a book in 1994. She is a 1984 graduate of Georgetown University's School of Foreign Service. She is married to Miltos Catomeris, an architect whose specialty is academic, institutional and corporate campuses. They are the parents of three children.

Dorothy Denberg, Dean of the College

Dorothy Denburg has been Dean of the College at Barnard since 1993. As the College's chief student affairs officer, she oversees all student services to support the academic mission of the College and enhance student life on campus. From 1999 - 2001, Denburg chaired the Task Force on Campus Life, which was charged to "examine and assess campus life" at Barnard. Currently she is working on the implementation of a Residential Master Plan and with others on the planning for a new six-story mixed use building on campus.

In fall 2001, Denburg was a Visiting Scholar at the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation in New York. She was a member of the Advisory Board of the National Institute on Technology and Liberal Learning (NITL) for the Mid-Atlantic and New England Region from 2002 to 2006, and she currently chairs the Steering Board of the Consortium on High Achievement and Success, a consortium of 30 liberal arts colleges and small universities, which seeks to enhance the college experience of historically under-represented students of color. She was a consultant to the President of Hunter College (CUNY) on academic advising in 2001-2002 and was a member of an external team to review the counseling service at Wesleyan University (2003.)

Elizabeth Boylan, Provost and Dean of the Faculty

Elizabeth S. Boylan was named Barnard's Provost and Dean of the Faculty in July 1995, and served as Acting President in Fall 2000. She also holds the rank of professor of biological sciences with tenure. Provost Boylan has been involved recently in the design and programming for Barnard's new campus building, the Nexus, which will house a distinctive combination of academic departments and programs, the Library's main reading room and computer center, a black box theatre, classrooms, and space for student activities, retail dining and special events. Earlier she coordinated the planning and implementation of an \$8+ million renovation of the science facilities in Milbank and Altschul Halls and led the first systematic review of the College's general education requirements since the early 1980's, resulting in the adoption of new curricular requirements for students entering in fall 2000. Provost Boylan has also been involved in various faculty development and leadership development projects, both at Barnard and through

organizations and foundations such as the American Council on Education, Project Kaleidoscope and the Mellon Foundation.

A specialist in developmental biology and cancer research, Provost Boylan earned a Ph.D. in zoology from Cornell University and a bachelor's degree in biological sciences from Wellesley College. She came to Barnard from Queens College/CUNY where she was associate provost for academic planning and programs. While at Queens, she held a joint appointment at the Graduate School of the City University of New York and was involved with University-wide efforts in program reform in science, engineering, technology and mathematics, and in secondary education. She holds a U.S. patent and has been a consultant for, among others, the National Cancer Institute, the National Science Foundation and the American Cancer Society. From 1999 through 2004 she served as Commissioner on the Commission on Higher Education of the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools.

Anna Quindlen, Chair of the Board of Trustees, Barnard Class of 1974

Over the last 30 years, Anna Quindlen's work has appeared in some of America's most influential newspapers, many of its best-known magazines, and on both fiction and non-fiction bestseller lists. She is a novelist and also writes the prestigious "Last Word" column in Newsweek magazine. Her latest novel, Blessings, is a New York Times bestseller and was recently made into a television movie starring Mary Tyler Moore. Quindlen is currently working on a new collection of essays, Loud and Clear, to be published in April 2004.

A columnist at The New York Times from 1981 to 1994, in 1990 Quindlen became only the third woman in the paper's history to write a regular column for its influential Op-Ed page when she began the nationally syndicated "Public and Private." A collection of those columns, Thinking Out Loud, was published by Random House in 1993 and was on The New York Times Best Seller List for more than three months. In 1992 Quindlen won the Pulitzer Prize for Commentary.

Quindlen joined the Times in 1977 as a general assignment reporter and was named the paper's deputy metropolitan editor in 1983. She wrote the "About New York" column from 1981 to 1983 and created the column, "Life in the 30's" in 1985.

In 1995 Quindlen left the world of newspapers, which she had joined as a copy girl at age 18, to become a novelist full-time. Quindlen has written four bestselling novels: Object Lessons (1991), One True Thing (1994), Black and Blue (1998) and

Blessings (2002). How Reading Changed My Life was released in September 1998 as was One True Thing, a Universal feature film starring Meryl Streep. Black and Blue, which spent six months on The New York Times Best Seller List, was chosen for Oprah's Book Club, and was made into a television movie. With the release of A Short Guide To A Happy Life in 2000, Quindlen became the first writer ever to have books appear on the fiction, nonfiction, and self-help New York Times Best Seller lists. The book sold close to a million copies.

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Biographic Information for Medal of Distinction Recipients

Indra K. Nooyi [new-yee]

Chair of the board and chief executive officer of PepsiCo Indra K. Nooyi leads one of the world's largest food and beverage companies, with 2008 annual revenues of more than \$43 billion. Her global perspective and commitment to sustainable growth have contributed to making her one of corporate America's top visionaries. She is consistently named on *Forbes* magazine's annual list of the 100 most powerful women in the world.

Irene Winter

An art historian and authority on the art and architecture of ancient Mesopotamia, Irene J. Winter is the Boardman Professor of Fine Arts at Harvard University, where she has served on the faculty since 1988. She is widely published on the archaeology of the ancient Near East, and has been active in encouraging U.S. and international efforts to recover and restore looted archaeological materials in Iraq and control the plundering of sites.

Kay C. Murray

Kay C. Murray is an attorney and former general counsel to the New York City Department of Juvenile Justice. Honored for her legal work and her tireless commitment to diversity in the public and private sector, she has served as an inspiration and mentor to young women pursuing careers in law. She is a past president of the Columbia Law School Alumni Association and the recipient of the Lawrence A. Wien Prize for Social Responsibility.

Mr. Chairman, Senator Gregg, and Members of the Subcommittee, it's a pleasure to be with you this afternoon.

When I appeared before the Senate Appropriations Committee a few weeks ago with Secretary Gates, we both emphasized the need for a comprehensive approach to the challenges on our nation's agenda. We face instability in Afghanistan, Pakistan, Iraq, and the Middle East; transnational threats like terrorism, nuclear proliferation, and climate change; and urgent development needs ranging from extreme poverty to pandemic disease that have a direct impact on our own security and prosperity.

These are tough challenges, and we would be foolish to minimize the magnitude of the task ahead. But we also have new opportunities. By using all the tools of American power—the talent of our people, well-reasoned policies, strategic partnerships, and the strength of our principles—we can make great strides against problems we've faced for generations, and also address new threats of the 21st century.

This comprehensive approach to solving global problems and seizing opportunities is at the heart of smart power. And the President's 2010 budget is a blueprint for how we intend to put smart power into action.

The President's FY 2010 budget request for the State Department and USAID is \$48.6 billion—a 7 percent increase over FY 2009 funding levels. We know that this request comes at a time when some other agencies are experiencing cutbacks. But it is an indication of the critical role the State Department must play to help advance our nation's interests, safeguard our security, and make us a positive force for progress worldwide.

In the face of formidable global challenges, our success requires a robust State Department and USAID working side-by-side with a strong military. To exercise our global leadership effectively, we need to harness all three Ds—diplomacy, development and defense.

This budget supports the State Department and USAID in three key ways: It allows us to invest in our people, implement sound policies, and strengthen our partnerships. We know it represents a major investment. And we pledge to uphold principles of good stewardship and accountability.

Let me begin with people. The men and women of the State Department and USAID have the world in their hands, but too many balls in the air. Many key positions at posts overseas are vacant for the simple reason that we don't have enough personnel. In Beijing, 18 percent of our embassy positions are open. In Mumbai, 20 percent. In Jeddah, Saudi Arabia, it's 29 percent. We face similar staffing shortages at the Department in Washington.

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To address the challenges confronting our nation, we need good people – and enough of them. That's why the President's 2010 budget request includes \$283 million to facilitate the hiring of over 740 new Foreign Service personnel. These new staff are part of a broader effort to fulfill the President's promise of expanding the Foreign Service by 25 percent:

The staffing situation at USAID is, if anything, more severe. In 1990, USAID employed nearly 3,500 direct hire personnel to administer an annual assistance budget of \$5 billion. Today, the agency's staff has shrunk by roughly a third, but they are tasked with overseeing \$13.2 billion in assistance. To provide the oversight that our taxpayers deserve and stay on target to meet our goal of doubling foreign assistance by 2015, we need more people manning the decks.

We also need personnel with the right skills to respond to the complex emergencies of the 21st century. To help meet this challenge, we are requesting \$323 million for the Civilian Stabilization Initiative – that includes expansion of the Civilian Response Corps. This group of professionals will help the United States stabilize and reconstruct societies in transition from conflict and civil strife.

With the right people in the right numbers, the State Department and USAID will be able to use smart power to implement smart policies. We are focusing on three priorities: *first*, urgent challenges and regions of concern, including Afghanistan and Pakistan, Iraq, and the Middle East; *second*, transnational challenges, and *third*, development assistance.

In Afghanistan and Pakistan, our effort centers on the President's goal to disrupt, dismantle, and defeat al Qaeda. We know that this will require a balanced approach that relies on more than military might alone. So we are expanding our civilian efforts and ensuring that our strategy is fully integrated and adequately resourced.

To create conditions that will prevent al Qaeda from returning to Afghanistan, we are helping Afghans revitalize their country's agricultural sector, which was once a major source of jobs and export revenue. We are supporting the Pakistani military as they take on the extremists who threaten their country's stability, and we are making long-term investments in Pakistan's people and democratically elected government through targeted humanitarian assistance. In both Afghanistan and Pakistan, we are holding ourselves and these governments accountable for progress toward defined objectives. Finally, we are seeking the resources to deploy a new strategic communications strategy to combat violence and empower voices of moderation in both countries.

As we move forward with the responsible redeployment of our combat forces from Iraq, this budget provides the tools we need to facilitate the transition to a stable, sovereign, self-reliant Iraq and to forge a new relationship with the Iraqi government and people based on diplomatic and economic cooperation.

Elsewhere in the Middle East, we are working with Israel and the Palestinian Authority to advance our goal of a two-state solution and a future in which Israel and its Arab neighbors can live in peace and security.

In addition to these urgent challenges, we also face a new array of transnational threats, including climate change, energy security, nonproliferation, and disease. These issues require us to develop new forms of diplomatic engagement – we cannot send a special envoy to negotiate with a pandemic, call a summit with carbon dioxide, or sever relations with the global financial crisis. By supporting the Department’s use of new tools and strategies, the President’s budget will enable us to confront the threats and seize the opportunities of our interconnected world. For example, we are working through the Major Economies Forum and to prepare for the United Nations Climate Conference in Copenhagen. We are deploying new approaches to prevent Iran from obtaining nuclear weapons, and are now a full partner in the P-5+1 talks. And the President has launched a six-year, \$63 billion Global Health Initiative to help combat the spread of disease.

This budget also reflects the critical role that development assistance must play in our foreign policy. We are proposing significant investments for critical programs including \$525 million for maternal and child health, nearly \$1 billion for education, \$1.36 billion to address the root causes of food insecurity, and \$4.1 billion for humanitarian assistance, including care for refugees and displaced persons and emergency food aid. These initiatives build good will, alleviate suffering, and save lives, but they also make our country safer and our partners stronger. Smart development assistance advances our values and our interests. Our assistance programs will also reduce the risk of instability in countries that face a variety of political, economic, and security challenges. Providing responsible governments with economic support now can help avert far more expensive interventions in the future.

Our smart power approach will rely on partnerships to magnify our efforts. These partnerships begin within our own government. We are seeking an unprecedented level of cooperation between agencies.

Secretary Gates highlighted this cooperation when he testified with me before you last month. Partnerships are also vital beyond our borders. None of the great problems facing the world can be solved without the United States, but we cannot solve any of these problems on our own. We are energizing our historic alliances in Europe and Asia, strengthening and deepening our bilateral ties with emerging regional leaders like Indonesia, Brazil, Turkey, Mexico, and India, and establishing more constructive, candid relationships with China and Russia. As we work to maximize the benefits of our policies and to ensure that global burdens are broadly shared, we must also make more effective use of international organizations. Our budget request provides \$4.1 billion for contributions to multilateral organizations and peacekeeping efforts—money which will fulfill our obligations to the United Nations and other international organizations, including full funding of all 2010 payments to the Multilateral Development Banks.

We are also expanding our partnerships beyond traditional government-to-government efforts. In addition to working with women, civil society, and human rights activists around the world, we are also encouraging more people-to-people cooperation. Last week at Yankee Stadium, I announced the creation of a Virtual Student Foreign Service that will bring together college students in the United States and our embassies abroad to work on digital and citizen diplomacy initiatives.

Finally, we must rely on sound principles to guide our actions. We are committed to practicing what we preach. And this includes a commitment to accountable governance at home and abroad.

As we seek more resources, we have a responsibility to ensure that they are expended wisely. We are working to make the Department more efficient, more transparent, and more effective. For the first time, we have filled the position of Deputy Secretary for Resources and Management. Together, we are working to increase efficiency and implement reforms throughout the State Department and USAID.

Mr. Chairman, we're pursuing all of these policies because it is the right thing to do, but also because it is the smart thing to do. No country benefits more than the United States when there is greater security, democracy, and opportunity in the world. Our economy grows when our allies are strengthened and people thrive. And no country carries a heavier burden when things go badly. Every year, we spend hundreds of billions of dollars dealing with the consequences of war, disease, violent ideologies, and vile dictatorships.

Since last testifying before the committee, I have traveled around the globe, covering many miles and many continents. I can assure you that there is genuine eagerness to partner with us in finding solutions to the challenges we face.

Our investment in diplomacy and development is only a fraction of our total national security budget. But this country will make very few investments that do more, dollar-for-dollar, to create the kind of world we want to inhabit. By relying on the right people, the right policies, strong partnerships, and sound principles, we can lead the world in creating a century that we and our children will be proud to own – a century of progress and prosperity for the whole world, but especially for our country.

Thank you. I am delighted to be with you today and I feel privileged to be in El Salvador at this historic moment for the Salvadoran people. The transfer of power that we will witness tomorrow exemplifies the progress that has occurred throughout our hemisphere during the past two decades. This gathering – which is being co-hosted by two parties who were once at war – is hard evidence of the strength and durability of democracy and the promise it holds not only for this country, but for our region.

The United States is grateful for the productive relationship we have had with El Salvador during President Saca's time in office, and we are looking forward to similarly strong cooperation and friendship with the government of President-elect Funes. In El Salvador and throughout the region, we are focused not on old battles but on new partnerships that improve lives, advance democratic principles, and promote the common good – and we seek to work in a spirit of mutual respect with those who share our goal to make the Americas more peaceful and more prosperous.

President Obama has emphasized that it's not important whether ideas come from one party or another, so long as they move us in the right direction. This meeting builds on the work of the previous U.S. administration, but the President and I are also committed to re-

launching Pathways to Prosperity, and expanding its work to spread the benefits of economic recovery, growth, and open markets to the most vulnerable and marginalized citizens of our region.

To achieve the shared prosperity we seek, we must integrate our commitment to democracy and open markets with an equal commitment to social inclusion. Rather than defining economic progress simply by profit margins and GDP, our yardstick must be the quality of human lives, whether families have enough food on the table; whether young people have access to schooling from early childhood through university; whether workers earn decent wages and have safe conditions at their jobs; whether mothers and fathers have access to medical care for themselves and their children so that children dying before adulthood is a rarity, not an accepted fact; and whether every person who works hard and takes responsibility has the promise of a brighter future.

The global financial crisis has reinforced how closely our economies are linked – if there was any doubt before, there should be none now. We know that commerce between our nations is and will be a crucial part of our economic recovery. Achieving the type of broad-based prosperity that citizens of the Americas deserve and demand will require us to harness the talents of all our citizens. Pathways to Prosperity can and will help spread the benefits of economic cooperation and trade to women, rural farmers and small businesses, Afro-descendants, indigenous communities, and others too often left on the sidelines of progress.

To succeed, we must:

- Set concrete goals;
- Broaden the scope and the impact of our efforts; and

- Develop a plan with mile markers that will allow us to assess our progress.

The 13 Pathways countries represent 34 percent of the world's GDP – we know how to get things done. Our work within this partnership should focus on achieving tangible results. We all need to be in what I call the solutions business.

We already have examples of cooperation on trade and development producing real progress for our citizens. In Honduras, the Food for Progress program found new markets for the potatoes grown by 1,400 small farmers. As a result, the farmers' sales doubled, and they increased their average annual income from less than \$800 to \$2,100. In Peru, the Micro and Small Enterprise Facilitation Program has helped more than 80 municipalities implement new regulations for business creation. They've cut business registration time by 80% and reduced costs by more than half. In Chile, collaborative work to satisfy trade and sanitary regulations allowed small farmers to take advantage of the season difference between the northern and southern hemispheres, and secure new markets for strawberries and other summer crops in the U.S. and Canada. We've also seen successful efforts to protect labor rights. And our newest trade initiatives, like Peru's Free Trade Agreement with the United States, have been designed to encourage good environmental stewardship.

The farmers, small businesses, and workers that benefit from these programs know the difference between rhetoric and results. We need to build on these successes, and ensure that all citizens of our hemisphere can share in the benefits of economic cooperation and social equity.

For Pathways, this will mean expanding beyond our current focus and our current membership. We should work to promote educational exchanges and language training programs to harness the power of underprivileged youth and lay the foundation for regional cooperation among future generations. We should provide technical assistance to rural businesses and others who lack easy access to global markets. I hope we will supply women entrepreneurs with mentors, training, and other tools for success, as the United States is planning to do through its Pathways Envoys program. We can expand the availability of microcredit loans.

And Pathways should be open to working with new partners including other nations and sub-regional banks that share our commitment to open markets and greater social inclusion. I want to note the presence of the observer countries [final list pending] that are here today. Going forward, I hope you and other countries from our hemisphere will be able to join us in this initiative as full members.

The Americas are becoming more connected and more dynamic. As this trend continues, our region will need to provide greater leadership on a broad array of global issues. Pathways is one example of the kind of multilateral partnership that can help address the complex challenges of the 21st century.

Today, in El Salvador, let us look back and acknowledge the progress we have made in building democracy and peace throughout our region. But let us also embark together down a new path defined by shared responsibilities, shared opportunities, and a commitment improve the life of every citizen in the Americas. We are part of the same family, this continent is our common home, and we will inhabit a common

May 2009 Rwandan School Book Drive Update

Background

Members of the New York Rwandan Diaspora, in collaboration with the Rwanda Permanent Mission to the United Nations and friends of Rwanda, launched a book drive from 1 April through 15 May, 2009 in honor of the 15th Anniversary of the 1994 Genocide, and in an effort to support the country's education system. Local mobilization around this project has generated immense support. We would like to extend our heartfelt thanks to individuals, schools, and organizations that reached out and took an active role in this project.

Targeted Beneficiaries

- The Huye district of the Southern Province of Rwanda, about 120 miles south of the capital city, Kigali, where we identified 100,000 student recipients in primary and secondary schools
- The newly-established private university in the Southern Province of Rwanda, IMENA
- The Miracle Corners of the World center in the Bugesera District
- The newly-established Center for Gender Studies, Culture & Development, affiliated with the Kigali Institute of Education

- Gorilla 1000 Clearing Agency s.a.r.l will facilitate customs clearance

The event was well attended by the Rwandan Community in the Diaspora from NY, NJ, Connecticut and Boston, as well as United Nations staff, New Yorkers and friends of Rwanda;
- It was a cultural event where the public highly praised the Rwandan traditional dancing and the screening of a short documentary raising awareness on the 1994 Genocide against Tutsi and the resilience of Duhozanye
- All proceeds went directly to Duhozanye to educate orphans in self-reliance skills and academics
- As a result of this support, orphans of Duhozanye have been able to attend various vocational trainings and gained skills in knitting, tailoring schools uniforms, carpentry and hairdressing
- In March 2009, seventy-seven young men and women completed the training programme and were awarded certificates in a public ceremony presided over by the Mayor of Gisagara district, and Daphrose Mukarutamu, the President of Duhozanye, along with other local government officials. Rwandans in the Diaspora were encouraged by this support and the benefit it brought to young people. We thank you all for your continued assistance promoting a positive change in Rwanda and look forward to your participation in the Book Drive for Rwandan Schools.

Rwanda's Beauty **Documentary Proposal**

Background

Rwanda's Beauty tells a contemporary story of two Rwandan women entrepreneurs who unite to found their country's first beauty vocational school for orphans.

The women, Jeanne Murekatete and Sylvie Mukamusi, are survivors of the 1994 genocide. After the war, they were inspired to provide for their families and rebuild their communities, thus opening their own businesses, beauty salons, in Kigali, the capital. Beauty services are an important part of Rwandan culture, and their businesses thrived. In combination, the two salons owned and operated by Jeanne and Sylvie today employ about twenty-eight men and women, serving as a powerful business model. However, while Jeanne and Sylvie hoped that their businesses could be a source of employment opportunity in their communities, with no local training available, they currently must import skilled labor from nearby countries.

Meanwhile, both have also taken in orphans after the genocide and watch this young generation of Rwandans with concern. Idle youth are always the "armies" of conflict, and in this delicate period of post-genocide reconstruction, Jeanne and Sylvie have become eager to take preventative measures against any potential future distress. Thus, they were inspired to open a beauty vocational school that would provide hope and a future for such youth, thereby keeping them and their country guarded from economic distress.

As members of the non-profit consulting firm, Business Council for Peace (Bpeace www.bpeace.org), Jeanne and Sylvie secured the organization's help in drafting a financial model. The coalition is now raising funds to launch the school, which they hope to accomplish in 2009. With the support of Bpeace and the international community, Jeanne and Sylvie are on the path to success in sustaining peace and stability through economic development in their country.

Scope of Film

Rwanda's Beauty highlights an untold and inspiring story about two every-day women in post-genocide Rwanda who not only took initiative for their own families, but also for their communities. The film will provide context on the history of Jeanne and Sylvie's relationship and will proceed by covering the evolution of the school. With filming expected to begin in the summer of 2009, the story will cover the majority of the planning process, the opening of the school, and the progress of the first class of orphans.

Purpose & Relevance

Coverage of post-genocide reconstruction in Rwanda is not new, but Jeanne and Sylvie bring a refreshing and important missing element that the world must see.

Under the leadership of business-savvy president, Paul Kagame, Rwanda is slowly but surely emerging from its current sixty percent poverty level. The government has been recognized globally for bringing Dell, IBM, Google, Starbucks, Costco, and many others into the country. While his efforts have attracted the attention of mainstream media, the incredible work of everyday people like Jeanne and Sylvie flies

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largely under the radar. Jeanne and Sylvie are empowering their youth and neighbors to help themselves. Moreover, Business Council for Peace's participation serves as a model for the global aid community, demonstrating support and encouragement for Rwandans and their dreams, rather than instructing them on action from a top-down approach.

Current research and short, narrative documentaries cover the following topics:

- What are the origins of ethnic conflict in Rwanda, and why did the 1994 genocide occur?
- What events were carried out during the genocide, and who was involved?
- How is the genocide being commemorated, and what is the healing process?
- How are people rebuilding, and who is involved in rebuilding?

All prior documentaries on the rebuilding process have been short films employing a narration, interviews, and an educational approach targeted to a non-Rwandan audience. *Rwanda's Beauty* will be the first feature film covering women entrepreneurs advancing Rwanda's peace and growth. Moreover, the style will not use narration and interviews about what the subjects *had* done. Rather, *Rwanda's Beauty* will cover a story as it unfolds, capturing the women, the orphans, and their supportive coalition in action as friendships develop and dreams become reality.

The chosen style will serve to educate a broader, global audience, and to showcase a light and inspiring story that unfolds among every-day Rwandan people. Prior documentaries on Rwanda have narrowly focused on a particular problem or issue specific to that country, taking a serious and academic approach. The goals of such works are to educate the developed world on a topic typically unimaginable to the audience. *Rwanda's Beauty* covers a topic familiar to the developed world, a beauty school, and will not only entertain, enlighten, and inspire the developed world, but Rwandans and others in developing countries, as well.

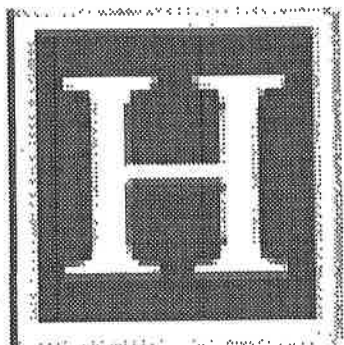

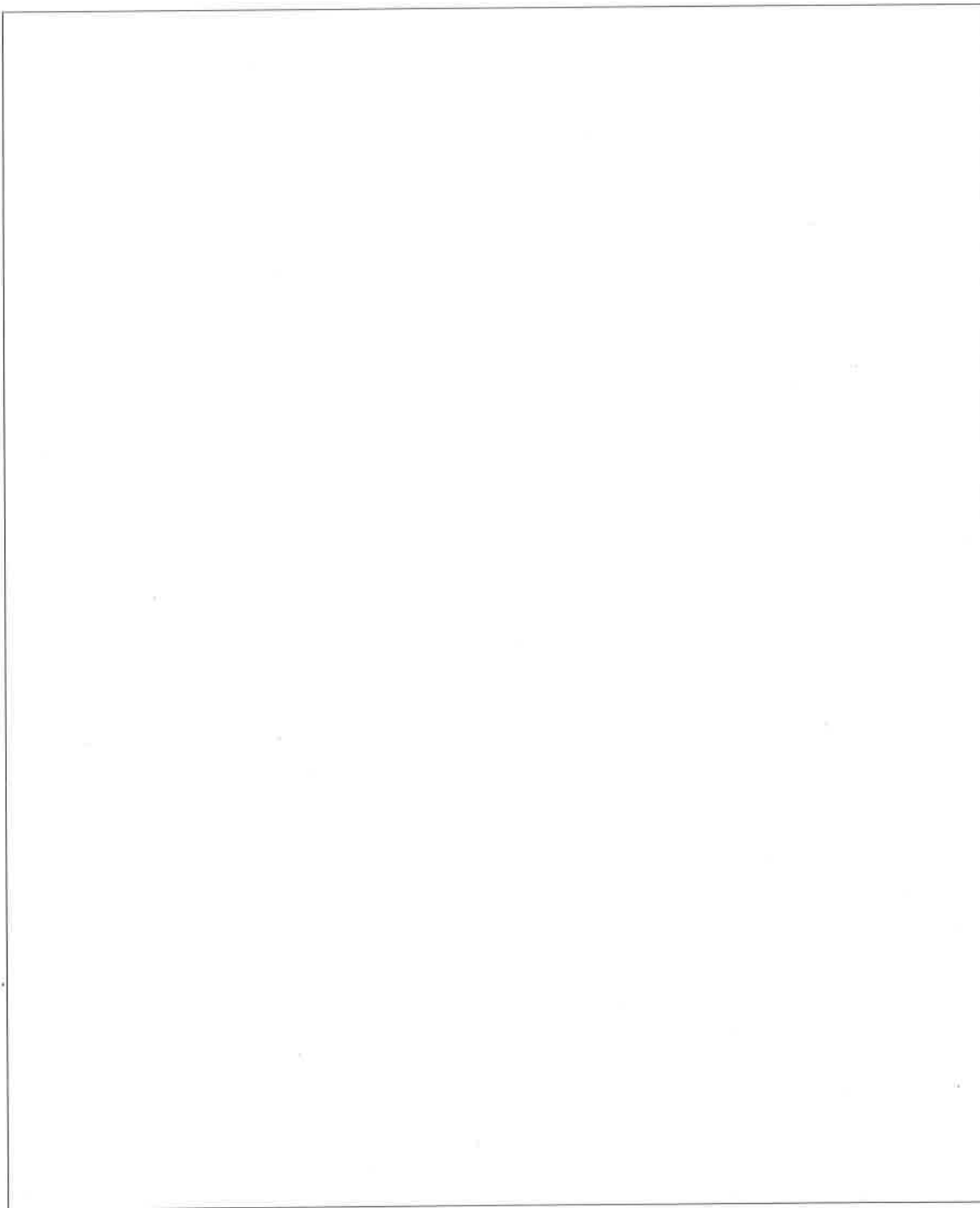

John and Burns, Great talking to you both this evening.

Burns, the United Methodist Bishops from around the world are coming to the Washington area for a weeklong gathering of bishops. Bishop John is host and arranging their schedule. John can tell you more details ... it would be wonderful if a time could be found sometime during the week (Sunday-Friday) for Hillary to meet with the entire group of bishops (around 100 total) or at least the leaders of the African bishops (perhaps a group of 10 or so).

John notes that the group can be flexible and accommodate Hillary's busy schedule. He suggests that there are a couple of ideal evening opportunities where all the bishops will be present: this Sunday evening at 6 pm at American University's Arts Center, or Wednesday at 6 pm at the Hyatt in Bethesda. There also is a Tuesday evening gathering and reception with just the African bishops -- 7 pm onwards at AP Shaw UMC in SE DC.

Obama is morphing into old rival Clinton

A year ago today, Barack Obama won the North Carolina and Indiana primaries, leading the late Tim Russert to famously declare, "We now know who the Democratic nominee will be, and nobody is going to dispute it."

Russert was right, but Hillary Clinton, nevertheless, kept campaigning for several more weeks, fueled by her supporters' convictions that her proposals were better than Obama's.

After barely 100 days in office, it now appears Obama agrees: Since taking office, he has dropped virtually every position that distinguished him from Clinton.

Granted, there were not many policy differences between Obama and Clinton during the campaign. But those that existed were sharply debated and helped Obama define himself as the pragmatic change agent that many voters now believe him to be.

Take Iraq. Obama never missed an opportunity on the campaign trail to remind Democrats that he was the sole candidate to oppose the war in 2002, and — unlike Clinton — he had a hard date for ending the war. Clinton repeatedly questioned the wisdom and sincerity of Obama's pledge to remove all combat troops from Iraq within 16 months of taking office. It was the biggest difference between the two candidates — and one of the top reasons Obama won the nomination.

Yet just weeks after entering office, Obama largely dropped his campaign plan. Rather than withdraw all combat troops on a set timeline, Obama opted for a conditions-based withdrawal that will leave as many as 50,000 troops in the war zone at the end of 2011 — exactly the sort of drawdown he maligned Clinton for proposing.

Health care is another example. While Obama was outflanking Clinton on the left on Iraq, she made up for it by criticizing his health care plan as inadequate. Both candidates claimed to support universal health care, but only Clinton's plan included a government mandate that would force all Americans to have health insurance.

Primary voters will recall Clinton and Obama endlessly debating this, with Clinton accusing Obama of leaving about 15 million people without health care and Obama warning voters that Clinton's plan would require "harsh, stiff penalties on those who don't purchase it."

Just as with Iraq, Obama is now moving toward Clinton's position. His budget outline proposes a health care plan that "must put the United States on a clear path to cover all Americans." That strongly suggests a mandate, since any volunteer system would see some opting out. As Ezra Klein reported in *The American Prospect* when the administration's health care plan began to leak out, "Despite the controversy over the individual mandate in the campaign, [Obama's team] will support it."

Some of the most significant differences between Clinton and Obama focused on governing. One of Obama's first breakthrough moments was at the YearlyKos convention in August 2007, when Clinton defended her relationships with lobbyists, saying "a lot of those lobbyists, whether you like it not, represent real Americans." Drawing a sharp contrast, Obama promised to ban anyone who had recently worked as a lobbyist from serving in his administration.

But that promise was broken even before he took office, when the president-elect chose several lobbyists for high-level posts, including deputy secretaries at the Defense and Health and Human Services departments. (Ironically, Obama even nominated a lobbyist to be an assistant secretary of state under Clinton.)

Obama's campaign also made Clinton's partisanship an issue. In a thinly veiled reference to Clinton's poor standing among Republicans, his stump speech included overt pleas for Republican support. Presenting himself as a post-partisan leader, he promised to forge a new era of bipartisanship in Washington.

As Obama confessed at his prime-time press conference last week, he's fallen short on that front, too. Since taking office, the president's agenda has been demonstrably partisan; nearly every bill he has so far signed into law passed Congress on a party-line vote. If Clinton were sitting in the Oval Office instead of Obama, it's hard to imagine how Washington would be any more partisan.

Clinton lost the battle for the Democratic nomination, but a year later, it appears her campaign has won the war of ideas within the Democratic Party.

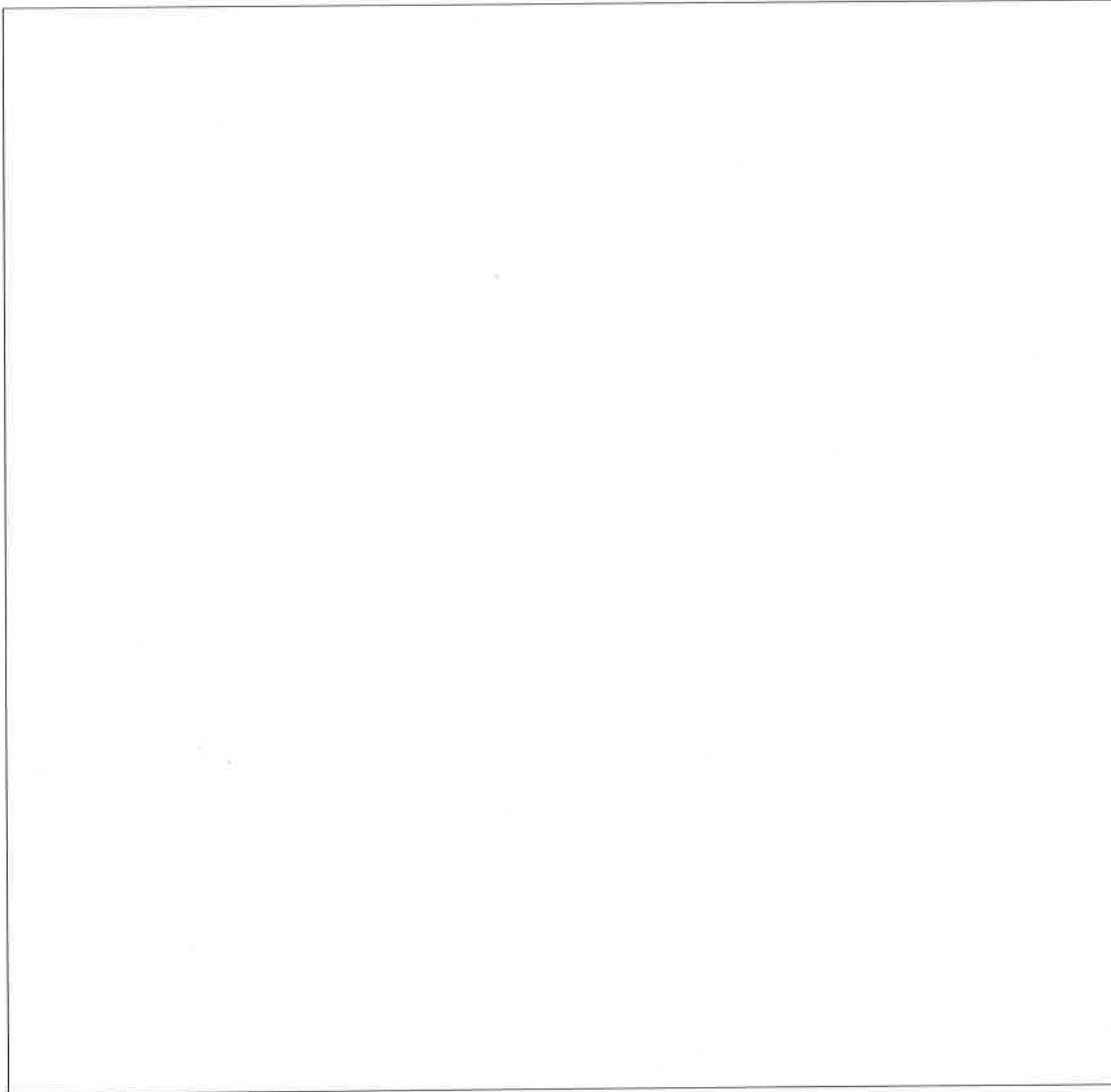

Thanks for the opportunity to suggest a line or two -

1. As a Yankees fan (though not as expert as Kris), and an eyewitness to the "cap" fiasco, I share everyone's sensitivity to sports references. But I'm not dead set against trying to leverage that sensitivity in a self-deprecating, appropriately funny way. A couple thoughts along those lines:

- a. "As you can see, I resisted the urge to wear my Yankees cap."
- b. (If the stage is set up near, for example, second base; substitute whatever part of the field she's near) "This is about as close as I'm going to get to playing second base for the Yankees"
- c. "I kind of feel at home here in Yankee Stadium, because ever since January, I've been playing on a team with a bunch of guys wearing pinstripes."

(on the other hand, I'm a little concerned about suggesting that the 1923 team "looked the same, talked the same, and came from the same cities and towns" - seems to be a little dismissive of a team that included such outsized personalities as Babe Ruth and Lou Gehrig.

Also, saying "Today's Yankees play with the strength of a global team" could provoke an unintended laugh because they are playing so poorly this year, so far. Maybe safer to broaden it to all of baseball - like "Major League Baseball is comprised of truly global teams."

And the "I don't care whether you bring us home a World Series" seems like stretching too far for a sports metaphor, but in a way that doesn't really make sense in context. maybe better as "I have every confidence that you will...You are starting your post-graduate life on a field of dreams, and you have every reason to believe that your own dreams of a better world can come true." (or something akin to that).

2. I think the speech could benefit from one clear "soundbite" that more succinctly captures the essence of her remarks. More of a clarion call to service, something like:

"...And I hope some of you will join our ranks. But the State Department cannot go up against the great challenges of our time alone. And so my message to you today is this: be the special envoys of your ideals, using the vast communications

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tools at your disposal to help advance the interests of this nation and every nation. Be citizen ambassadors in the course of your personal and professional lives, helping to forge partnerships built on mutual interest in the face of global crises. By creating diplomatic social networks, you can extend the powers of our and every government to meet the needs of this generation...and help lay the groundwork for the kind of public-private alliances we need to end hunger, defeat disease, combat global warming and give every child the chance to live up to her or his God-given potential."

(and maybe go from there into a little riff like "Don't sell yourselves short. Many of you showed your capacity to bring change by helping bring Barack Obama to the presidency." (And then, after the inevitable applause at that line, follow with this quip, with a smile: "Where were you when I needed you?")

Finally, just a couple small notes:

– "half of my senior staff used to work here" - the word "here" given that it's in Yankee Stadium might confuse a little - better perhaps to say "used to work at NYU."

– "swine flu" - hasn't the government been trying to avoid using that phrase? (I like that sentence overall)

– nice examples with Colombia and Kilimanjaro - though just wondering, since I'm ignorant of the facts, is it too much to say that the Facebook project really did more than years of military action?

– if you happen to like the Obama reference above, then it would supplant the "social networking platforms" line in the speech - but if you don't like my suggestion, I would still suggest changing the "I am told" as that sounds a little gratuitous - better to be a little more self-deprecating, like "And there was also a recent presidential election in which social networks brought legions of young people into the electoral process...a few more into certain campaigns than others, I'm afraid to say..." or something like that.

– also, if you don't use the suggested Obama reference, I do think his name should be used somewhere in the speech.

– "suited up" doesn't sound like HRC to my ear.

love the examples of things people can do online to make a difference. also like and agree with idea of being short and punchy.

thanks again for the chance to suggest a couple thoughts...

FYI I have attached an article that was in the Portuguese Times (a major newspaper here in New England). The article is about the same as other Portuguese American news advocating for a Portuguese American for the post in Portugal [redacted]. I have been doing some research and Brazil, Italy, Greece and a number of other countries have positions of "Counsel General" in addition to Ambassador and they are usually located in other locations in the country quite a distance away from the main Embassy. For example in Italy the main office is in Rome but Counsel General slots are in Florence and Milan. In Brazil they are in Rio and Sao Paulo etc. My point is in the transition it may be possible to have a Counsel General in the Azores! There are two autonomous regions of Portugal ...the Azores and the Madeira Islands and both of these locations are quite a distance away from mainland Portugal. Consular services are already available at these locations and the Azores has a new substantial building to house their offices for the American Consulate to the Azores (I thought it was a Counsel General slot) . The Azores has a substantial program going on with the U.S. and many of our institutions and with someone in place there who was familiar with the people on both sides of the Atlantic many positive things could happen. MIT-Portugal has a major program on sustainable development [redacted] to help develop in partnership with UMass Dartmouth in MA. we may have an announcement with the Minister of Science for Portugal and the Regional Government in June! So much that can be done. MIT and Portugal are using the Azores as there Green Islands Project to create modules that could be replicated anywhere to create renewable sources of energy. Essentially they are using the Azores as a laboratory for sustainable development...work that can have a major impact as it pertains to Climate change. The support of the Portuguese people on both sides of the Atlantic, my strong background and ties with the Azores and all regions of the Country, and my work on climate change and trade promotion with [redacted] would make this the right time to make such a move, especially if the Ambassador is not going to be anyone of Portuguese background. As you may know most of the Portuguese in the U.S. are from the Azores and the majority are from MA and RI and other states like NJ, CA, Ct, and Hawaii also have a significant population of Portuguese Americans. Anyway it is my understanding that these slots may be changed with the cooperation of office of Personnel Management and State. As you know we should have the support of [redacted] for such an initiative. I would certainly be interested! I could be helpful to a new ambassador and such a position could possibly put me in a strong position for a second round for Ambassador. Thanks for your continued help on this. I look forward to talking with you soon....please give the Secretary my very best.

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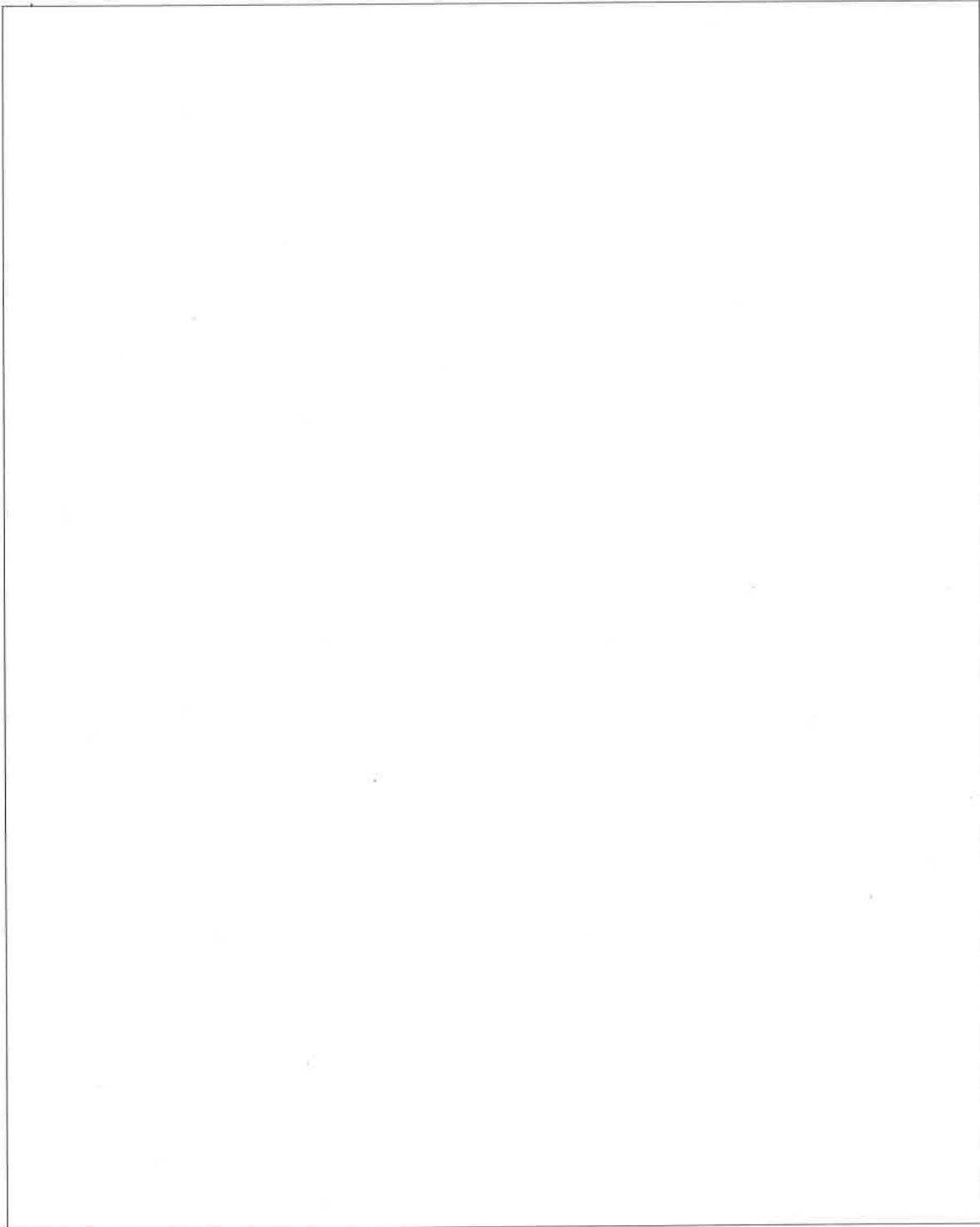

I also write to share that I spoke with [redacted] this morning—he'd called early last week, but we finally connected today. A real honor to be one of the folks [redacted] is seeking out for counsel—and one I don't take lightly! As you undoubtedly know, he's been offered a new role in the Obama administration, reporting directly to Hillary, would oversee [redacted]. Dear Margo and Jill,

I'm writing to see if you might help me secure a meeting with Secretary Clinton to talk about my ideas for a \$500 million Global Innovation Fund that invests in "what works" in international development and would complement the work President Obama is doing with his domestically-focused Social Innovation Fund.

The world needs a new vision for development. This is the moment for experimentation and a new commitment to innovation and change. The U.S. spent \$23.5 billion on foreign assistance in 2006. If we experimented with just \$500 million to invest capital and technical assistance in social enterprises focused on results, accountability and scale, we could build real blueprints for change. At Acumen Fund we see so many impactful and promising innovations; the State Department would be a powerful partner in scaling those successes.

A global social innovation fund would be particularly impactful in Pakistan. The U.S. may commit \$11.5 billion over five years to Pakistan, and it is critical that we look closely at how we might spend that money. In Acumen Fund's seven years working in Pakistan we have found that models for change exist, and we have built a powerful community of entrepreneurs and supporters within Pakistan. As you know we have invested in organizations like Satban, which has provided low-cost housing to more than 60,000. There is FMIA, a joint venture that has sold more than 30,000 health insurance policies. And Kashf, a microfinance institution serving more than 300,000 poor women by making small loans to help themselves change their own lives. The challenge is to grow these solutions from reaching hundreds of thousands to the millions most in need.

I believe this kind of investment in Pakistan is the "smart power" that Secretary Clinton referred to in her speech at the Global Philanthropy Forum. She has an incredible vision and Acumen Fund would love to find ways to support her.

Anything you could do would be truly appreciated. And do let me know anything I can do on this end as I feel a deep sense of urgency and want to do all I can to contribute.

I think this is very good. I really like the emphasis on security, which is part of her brand, and very relevant (I always have in the back of my mind the possibility that great tragedy will strike again, so we need to be prepared to deal with that reality, should it come about some day)

I like combining that with the notion of prosperity and humanity, which together covers so much ground - from economic development to human rights

A couple misc thoughts --

- in terms of promoting prosperity/economic development, might there be a reason to technological advancement (giving people access to education and technological tools that can help them in terms of both education and access to social networks and other avenues for advancement). You do reference education in the development arena, and in prosperity, so that's good).

- there isn't much here mentioning democratization, freedom, etc. I know that is probably dicey given the multitude of governments we want to partner with that aren't ready to talk that talk, but still think it needs to be incorporated in some aspect of a mission statement

- really like strong reference to women as a key to economic and social stabilization. That ties into her "brand" and into a reality. I know when the First Ladies of Africa came out here to LA, one of the desires was to try to draw them into an alliance that might transcend their own national differences and create cross-border force for positive change. A friend of mine is one of the executives with the Hunger Project, whose CEO is a woman who focuses, too, on the way targeting women can help alleviate hunger in ways that just dealing with men or generally cannot.

- really like that 'variable geometry' reference. This is kind of like 3 dimensional chess - strange and complicated alliances need to be made to grapple with a multitude of cross-cutting challenges. This is calculus, not arithmetic.

- would like to be sure religions are involved here, vis a vis the various partnerships. It can be either a powerful force of positive change, or it can get in the way of progress, depending on how it's used or abused, but to the extent allowed Constitutionally, the power of religion should be encouraged in the direction of alliances and partnerships of progress

- as I think about Kennan's "containment" doctrine a little further - in some ways it can be reapplied to extremism, meaning that our goal should be to contain not Communism this time, but extremist ideology wherever it exists, and just as Kennan supported, development is one of the ways to build those walls of containment around a dangerous ideology. We want to contain extremist, nihilistic, violent ideologies and movements wherever they might take root, and a good way to do that is to focus on development, on women, on technology, on education.

The power of diplomacy rests on two foundations. On the one hand, there is the reality and potentiality of military force. Without having the capacity to defend, and to

project force, diplomacy is inherently weak and ineffectual.

On the other hand, development is the other foundation upon which successful diplomacy can be built. It's the carrot to the military's stick. And the State Department has an integral role to play in both the diplomatic and developmental parts of that tripod (while also being understanding of, and when necessary supportive of, implementing the military part).

The connective tissue of security, prosperity and humanity is, as you suggest, "purpose," or more prosaically - "morality." Morals. It is immoral for people to live in fear, to be unprotected, to be subject to harm and death. It is immoral for people's human rights to be violated, to not have access to education and health. And it is immoral to be denied the opportunity to grow, to create a better future for children, etc. To let, as Roy has said, every child to live up to his or her God-given potential.

one last point - on shared humanity, perhaps protecting the natural resources of the Earth - environmentalism - should be referenced along with health and human rights. It's part of the underpinning of our international morality and the kind of partnership we need to solve global warming, etc.

1. This draft, sent by separate email, is intended to give you options and ideas. Use as you wish. Several ideas are at the core of this version: in particular, the concept of the US as a modern global nation and how that serves our capacity for leadership.
2. For most policy speeches a generic tone and workmanlike prose are acceptable. But for this one, it is not. This speech can't afford to be lackluster. It will then be held up in invidious comparison to Obama's glittering best efforts. Your speech must have, amid the policies, a distinctive and authoritative voice.
3. Your early draft makes no distinctions between allies or partners; indeed, it barely mentions allies. The early draft also features a strong malaise theme. Even if rebutted after being raised, the focus is on obstacles and hindrances, not on achievements, opportunities and what can be achieved. There's no accounting of progress so far. The effect is downbeat in tone. At the same time, the draft contains passages of vague and gauzy liberal universalism, while in one line assailing it, an unconvincing juggling act. The notion that all nations and peoples want the same things as Americans will not fly and is open to derision. It reflects blithe liberal cultural imperialism, among other things. (See Graham Greene. And, on the contrary, some nations—and peoples—seek nuclear weapons, like Iran; some don't want to curb global warming, like China; some don't care about human rights, like most Arab nations; some have contempt for democracy, including de facto allies like Egypt, not to mention Myanmar, and some are indifferent to poverty, any number of African kleptocracies.) Also there is some confusion of definitions, for example, asserting dialogue with adversaries is "strategic engagement," when that is a concept usually applied to allies and partners.
4. The speech must be crafted with a sense of real time and cannot be delivered out of sync with it. Slogans can become shopworn, especially those that lack analytical, historical and descriptive power. What served you once, at your confirmation, may not serve again in the same way. The most cogent foreign policy columnists from Clive Crook of the Financial Times to David Rothkopf of Foreign Policy have already written columns in the last week on the limits of "soft power" (i.e., "smart power") and others I understand are preparing to make similar criticisms. I would use sparingly or not at all. You do not

need to have a complex foreign policy agenda reduced to two words that the administration's adversaries will undoubtedly use against you



**U.S. DEPARTMENT OF STATE PARTNERS WITH THE NATIONAL ITALIAN AMERICAN FOUNDATION
TO ASSIST L'AQUILA UNIVERSITY FOLLOWING DEVASTATING EARTHQUAKE**

The U.S. Department of State has joined forces with the National Italian American Foundation (NIAF) in a public-private partnership to bring a generous American response to the people of Abruzzo, Italy, after the devastation caused by the April 6, 2009 earthquake. The focus of this partnership is to direct aid to L'Aquila University to restore its role as an important academic, social, and economic engine for the Abruzzo region. Initial projects include:

Adopt-a-Scholar: NIAF is working with several U.S. universities to provide scholarships for up to 200 students from the University of L'Aquila who were displaced by the earthquake to enable them to continue their academic studies in the United States starting fall semester 2009 for up to a year. The scholarships will cover tuition, international travel, room and board, as well as textbooks and supplies.

Building Earthquake-Resistant Modular Multipurpose Centers: The destruction of nearly all the buildings of the University of L'Aquila has created an immediate need for dormitories and other buildings. Supported by NIAF, U.S. technology will be used to build in summer 2009 inherently-flexible, modular multipurpose centers.

Exchanges to the United States: Four local government and University of L'Aquila leaders will travel to the United States under a State Department exchange program to visit academic institutions experienced in crisis response. Another State Department-sponsored exchange will bring L'Aquila University department heads and officials to New Orleans and other U.S. cities to examine how American universities have coped with rebuilding after a natural disaster. Both sets of visitors should travel in September 2009.

Exchange to Italy: The U.S.-Italy Fulbright Program will support a Senior Fulbright Specialist in a field identified by the University of L'Aquila to work there with University faculty on a collaborative project, as well as to develop ties with U.S. institutions. This specialist will be placed in L'Aquila for six weeks during the 2009-10 academic year.

Preserving Archives: The State Department will bring an expert archivist from the United States in the fall of 2009 or the winter of 2010 to perform an in-depth assessment of information resources in L'Aquila and to evaluate the needs of various libraries in L'Aquila, including digitalization of records.

Donation of Information Resources: The State Department will donate in the fall of 2009 and the winter of 2010 information and reference materials to assist L'Aquila's libraries. Donations will include general U.S. reference collections, DVDs, and audio-visual equipment.

He is former chair of the board of directors of PUSH for Excellence. In 1967, after leaving Mississippi, Dr. Poussaint joined the Tufts Medical School faculty as director of a psychiatry program in a low-income housing development. In 1969, he joined Harvard.

He is co-author, with James P. Comer, M.D., of *Raising Black Children*, 1992; co-author, with Amy Alexander, of *Lay My Burden Down*, 2000; and co-author, with Bill Cosby, of *Come on People*, 2007. He is a life fellow of the American Psychiatric Association, a fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science, a member of the American Academy of Child & Adolescent Psychiatry, and a fellow of the American Orthopsychiatric Association. 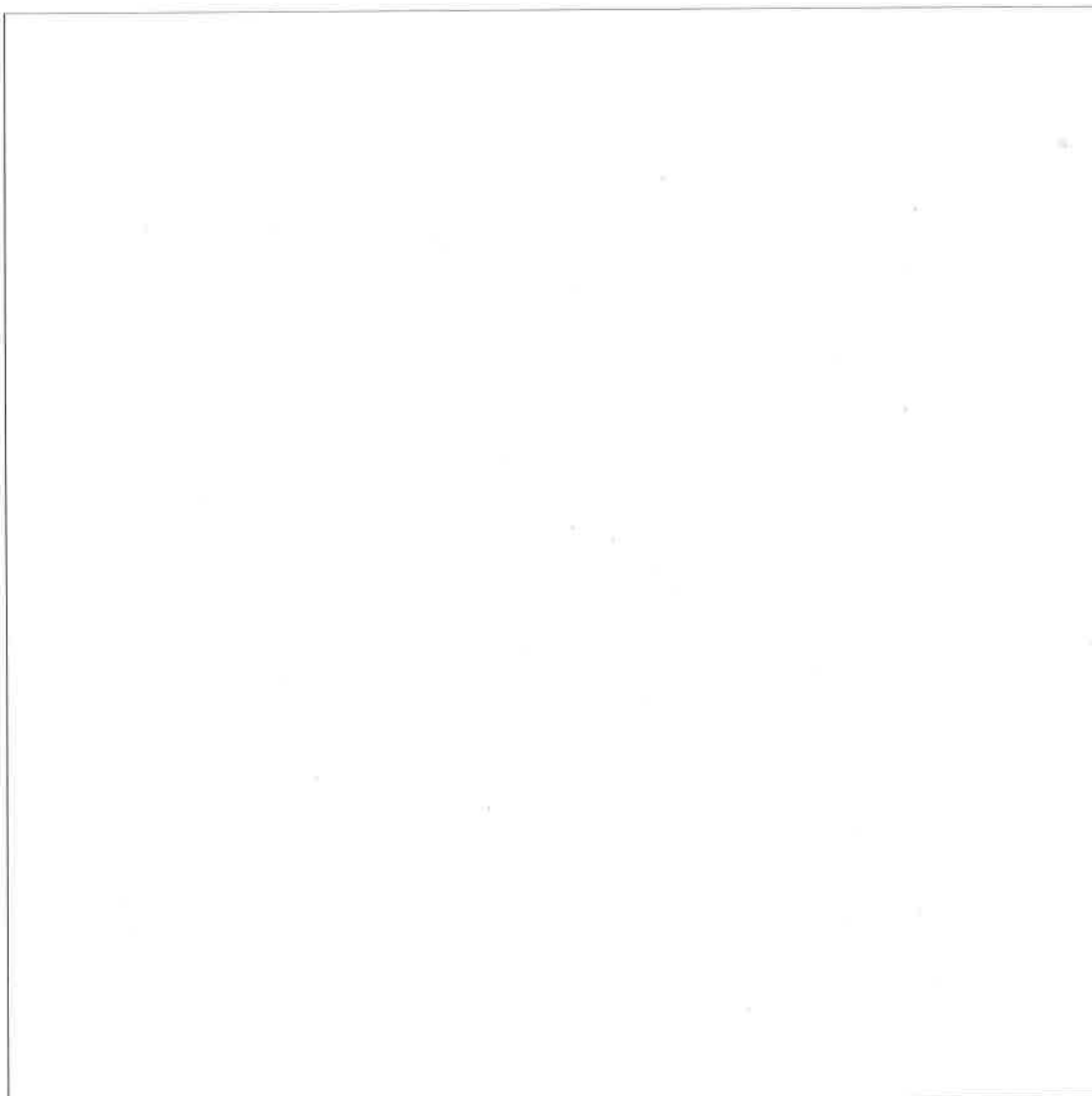

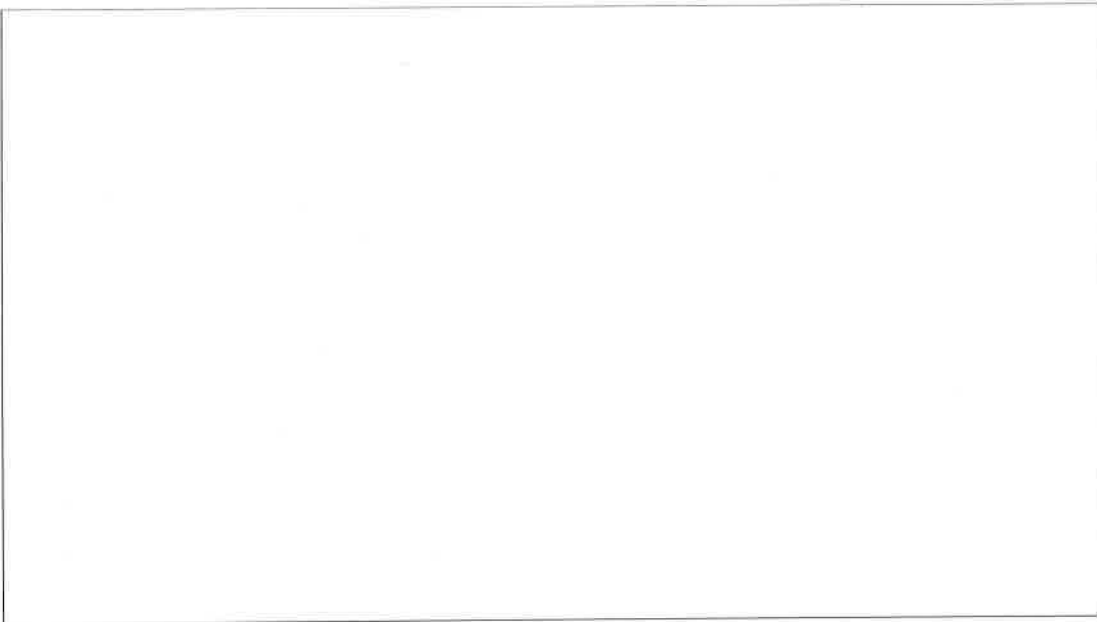

Anne-Marie Slaughter

Shanghai: I was driven around the expo site and saw how far advanced the Chinese pavilion is, also the Canadian and Brazilian pavilions that are facing and adjacent to us, and many spectacular European pavilions. In addition to the overwhelming size and grandeur of the expo site as a whole – it will be like the New York World's Fair on steroids – what struck me is that we must also hold up our end with the many visitors who will be coming from the Americas. The video of the history of world expositions that plays in the Shanghai exposition building and will help open the expo itself is a visual of rising American power – repeated expos in the 19th and 20th centuries in New York, Chicago, St. Louis, San Francisco and other American cities. Expos are the soft power Olympics and hence a key part of smart power; we should be willing to ask Congress for money and consider it extremely well spent in terms of building American power in the world – and cheap at the price.

I also had several meals and meetings with members of what I am coming to think of as “the American diaspora” – talented and entrepreneurial Chinese-Americans and Chinese raised/educated in America who have come back to China to live on the economic frontier – and who are spreading American values with them. They gave a very optimistic picture of the Chinese economy.

Beijing: I had dinner with “new media figures” [redacted]

In my official meetings on the S&ED we made real progress, getting the Chinese to agree to a closed meeting just with the four principals and getting them to agree to consider a model of a joint statement that we will now provide; I made very clear that a joint statement was critical to getting results. Later in the day we had a breakthrough with the Deputy

Minister of Commerce, who agreed to working level meetings and concrete "bottom-up" joint projects on development assistance. No one in the Bush Administration said to anyone that we can find in our Administration --

QUESTION: Not Elliott Abrams? He wrote about that.

No one in the Bush Administration said to anyone that we can find in our Administration --

QUESTION: Not Elliott Abrams? He wrote about that.

SECRETARY CLINTON: Nobody in a position of authority at the time that the Obama Administration came into office said anything about it. And in fact, there's also a record that President Bush contradicted even that oral agreement.

But the fact is that the Roadmap, which was agreed to officially, adopted by the Israeli Government, says something very clear about settlements. So I think that what the President is doing is saying, look, everybody should comply with the obligations you've already committed to. And for the Palestinians, let's not forget, they must end incitement against Israel, they must demonstrate an ability to provide security.

Vaccine Plan Aims to Spur Drug Development for Poor Nations

By MICHAEL M. PHILLIPS

LECCE, Italy -- A group of wealthy nations is launching a first-of-its-kind program designed to encourage pharmaceutical companies to develop vaccines for diseases common to poor countries.

The \$1.5 billion program marks a departure from previous charitable efforts to increase poor countries' access to vaccines. Instead of buying existing drugs and giving them away, the donors will guarantee pharmaceutical companies a future market big enough to justify developing and manufacturing new vaccines needed in nations too impoverished to afford them on their own.

The donors -- Italy, the U.K., Canada, Russia, Norway and the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation -- plan to announce the initiative Friday on the sidelines of a meeting of top finance officials from the Group of Eight major industrial powers, according to Italian officials.

The first target will be a vaccine to prevent pneumococcal disease, which kills 1.6 million people in the world a year, the majority of them young children in the developing world.

"It's a great step for global health," said Orin Levine, associate professor of international health at Johns Hopkins University and a longtime backer of the so-called advance-market commitment concept. He projects the funding mechanism could prevent between five million and eight million child deaths by 2030.

The advance-market commitment is intended to untie that knot. The donors, working through Unicef, the World Bank and the international vaccine agency GAVI Alliance, will promise to purchase new pneumococcus vaccines that meet specified criteria for safety, durability and effectiveness.

The U.S. waxed enthusiastic about the approach after Italy and Britain began championing it four years ago, but never came up with a contribution. The program has been in the works for some time and its rollout was hampered by a raft of legal issues.

The donors chose to go after pneumococcal disease rather than malaria, HIV-AIDS, tuberculosis or other infectious illnesses in part because the prospects appear good that new vaccines could hit the market as early as next year.

Pneumococcus is a bacteria that can cause pneumonia, septicemia and meningitis, and is thought to kill as many as one million children under the age of five each year, according to the World Health Organization.

The toll is also disproportionately high among the aged, poor and HIV-infected. Vaccines exist and are effective at preventing pneumococcal disease in the U.S. and Europe. But they can be less effective against pneumococcus strains prevalent in the developing world.

Mr. Levine said drug companies on their own don't have sufficient financial incentive to develop vaccines that could stem the deaths in poor countries.

New drug factories can cost \$200 million to \$300 million to build, on top of the cost of drug development.

In general, vaccines reach the developing world 10 to 15 years after they become widely used in rich countries, according to a recent report written by a British parliamentary panel.

"Usually, pharmaceutical companies have very little interest in investing in this type of research, since developing countries cannot afford these vaccines when they are developed," the Italian Ministry of

Economy and Finance said in a written description of the program.

At least two companies, Wyeth and GlaxoSmithKline PLC, have already signaled a potential interest in pursuing the advance-market commitment. Wyeth, which produces a pneumococcus vaccine used in the U.S., is looking at developing a new vaccine, according to a spokesman.

Glaxo might use the funding to increase manufacturing and distribution of an existing pneumococcus vaccine, according to a company spokesman.

Dear Hillary,

Hope you are resting comfortably. Please take this as an excuse to get much needed rest. Lots of people have expressed best wishes for you to me--Sean Wilentz, Joe Conason, Gene Lyons, etc--so if they haven't contacted you because you're behind a wall you should know that many, many people are thinking about you now.

I spoke this morning to Gary Sick, who, you recall, was senior person on NSC during the Iran hostage crisis, and is now at Columbia. He has one of the best intelligence networks on Iran, 1,500 people, experts with extensive contacts, and many Iranians, deeply embedded in the unfolding events. [redacted] Gary tells me that Mousavi has evolved from a mild-mannered reformer to directly challenging the regime. Nobody, he says, knows where this will go, certainly not the Iranians. Khamenei has exposed himself and lost his aura of mystification, plunging into the arena as a political player. Mousavi has issued a new revolutionary manifesto, just translated; I enclose below Sick's report and analysis on it. This poses, Sick says, a new challenge to Khamenei. Does he let it stand? Does he answer it? Sick also says US diplomacy in fact can't accomplish anything with the regime until the crisis completely works its way out, which could take years. He points out that the first mass demonstrations against the Shah occurred a full year before his overthrow. He adds that the one thing the regime has learned from the Shah is not to be equivocal toward demonstrations.

Two ideas, who knows, but here they are: 1. Though the regime uses Western protests to consolidate control, some of them contribute to its deep crisis of legitimacy. Sick says Obama's statement, for example, was good. He also cites a statement from Ban Ki Moon. If there would be a UN action, shouldn't it focus on the human rights/violence aspect? A statement and/or resolution urging the regime to stop illegitimate violence of paramilitary militias? US shouldn't initiate. 2. Establish linkage in negotiations with Russians on Start between their objections to missile defense outposts in Poland and Czech Republic (especially if we plan to give them up) with Russian arms sales to Iran.

Mousavi's New Revolutionary Manifesto

Today, Mir Hossein Mousavi, the presidential candidate who has come to represent the democratic aspirations of the Iranian people, issued <http://elections.7rooz.com/englishnews/Mousavi%27s_statement_number_5_to_iranian_people> a formal statement.

Although he denounces the "lies and fraud" of the leadership, particularly in the recent election, he views the fraudulent election as only as the symptom of something far more serious. He describes a revolution gone wrong, a revolution that was originally based on attention to the voice of the people but has resulted in "forcing an unwanted government on the nation."

It is apparent from this statement that Mousavi's movement—and Mousavi himself—have evolved enormously in the past week.

This moment is "a turning point," he says, and he defines the movement that is forming around him as having a "historical mission" to accomplish nothing less than "renewing the life of the nation" according to its own ideals.

He acknowledges, interestingly, that his own voice at the beginning was less "eloquent" than he would have wished and

that the people were ahead of him in turning the movement green. But now he accepts the "burden of duty put on our shoulders by the destiny of generations and ages."

He denounces both extremes of the political spectrum: on one hand those who believe that "Islamic government is the same as Tyranny of the Rightful;" and on the other, those who "consider religion and Islam to be blockers for realization of republicanism," i.e. those who believe that democracy is incompatible with Islam.

Mousavi says his call for annulment of the election and a revote, supervised by an impartial national body, "is a given right." The objective is nothing less than "to achieve a new type of political life in the country."

That is truly a revolutionary statement. He says he will stand by the side of all those seeking "new solutions" in a non-violent way. He accepts the principles and the institutions of the Islamic Republic, including the Revolutionary Guard and the basij, but denounces "deviations and deceptions." He demands reform "that returns us to the pure principles of the Islamic Revolution."

He calls for freedom of expression in all its forms, and says that if the government permits people to express their views freely, "there won't be a need for the presence of military and regulatory forces in the streets."

It is apparent from this statement that Mousavi's movement—and Mousavi himself—have evolved enormously in the past week. The candidate started as a mild-mannered reformer. After the searing events of the past several days, he has dared to preach a counter sermon to Khamenei's lecture on Islamic government. Although he never mentions the Leader by name, there is no overlooking the direct contradiction of his arguments. This open opposition to the Leader by a political figure is unprecedented.

Mousavi has in fact issued a manifesto for a new vision of the Islamic Republic. The repression and disdain of the government has brought the opposition to a place they probably never dreamed of going. And no one knows where any of the parties are likely to go next.

But for outside observers, it is like standing on the edge of a glacier and feeling the ice begin to crack under your feet. Gary Sick served on the National Security Council staff under Presidents Ford, Carter and Reagan. He was the principal White House aide for Iran during the Iranian Revolution and the hostage crisis and is the author of two books on U.S.-Iranian relations. Mr. Sick is a captain (ret.) in the U.S. Navy, with service in the Persian Gulf, North Africa and the Mediterranean. He was the deputy director for International Affairs at the Ford Foundation from 1982 to 1987, where he was responsible for programs relating to U.S. foreign policy. Mr. Sick has a Ph.D. in political science from Columbia University, where he is Senior Research Scholar, adjunct professor of international affairs and former director of the Middle East Institute (2000-2003). He is the executive director of Gulf/2000, an international research project on political, economic and security developments in the Persian Gulf, being conducted at Columbia University with support from a number of major foundations. He is co-editor of four books on the Persian Gulf published by the Gulf/2000 project and Palgrave (formerly St Martin's) Press in New York. Mr. Sick is a member (emeritus) of the board of Human Rights Watch in New York and founding chairman of its Middle East and North Africa advisory committee.

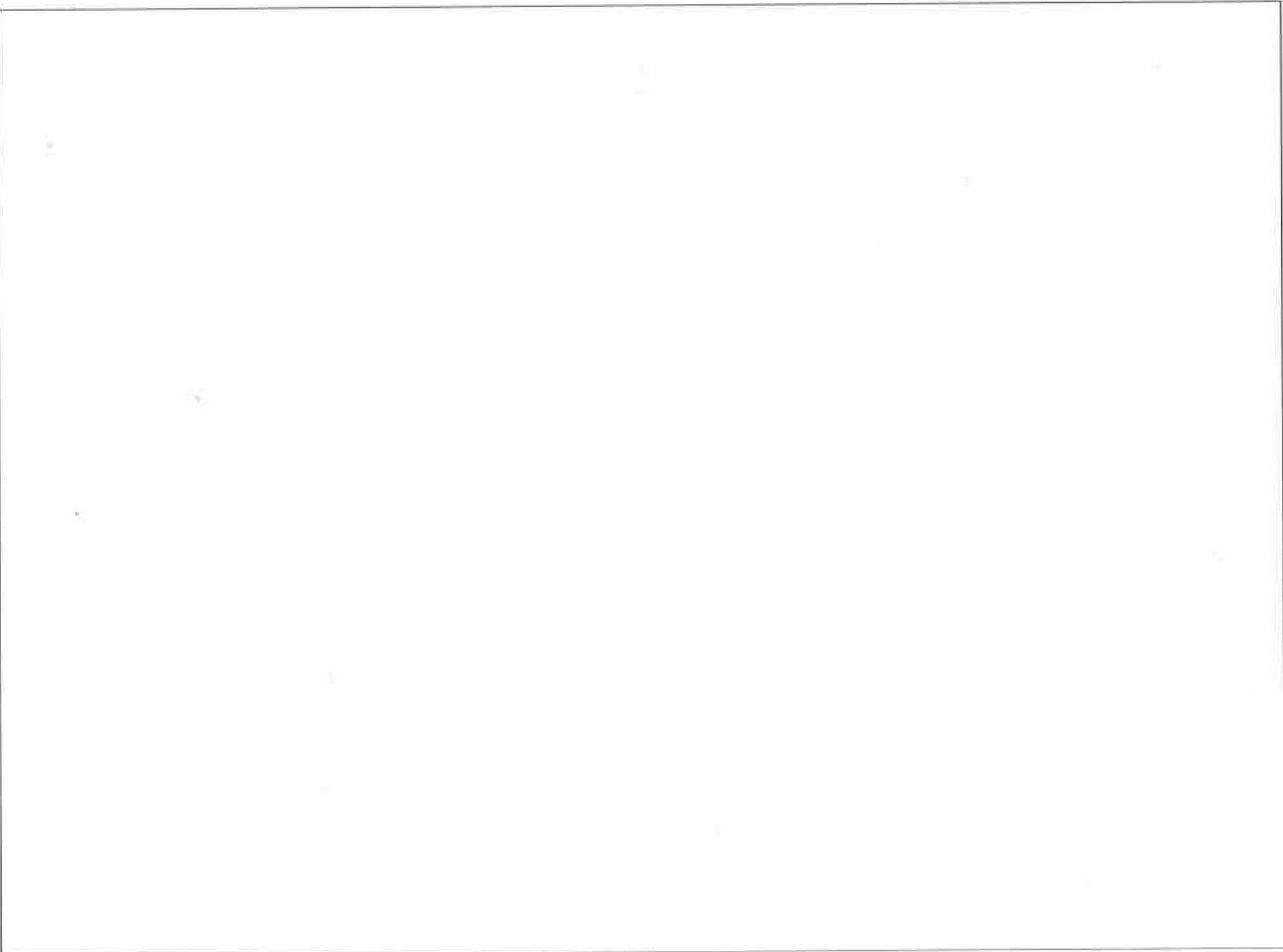

For what it's worth, my two cents, given Obama's statement yesterday, I think you can make two more forward statements on the Iranian situation without crossing a red line of appearing to interfere or become an internal factor: 1. The Iranians should adhere to their own standards on elections guaranteed by their law; and 2. The Iranian government should curb the political violence unleashed by paramilitary militias. You can underline Obama's remark that "the world is watching" but put it in the more memorable form: "The whole world is watching." On Bibi's speech, given the Iranian crisis he is getting a pass for the moment. Good timing for him. Consequently, he is on a "I'm reasonable" tour, his favorability has skyrocketed in the latest poll by more than 20 points, and Malcolm Hoelen is going around spreading the word that Obama cannot be trusted. The shortcomings of Bibi's poison pill proposal should be pointed out as soon as it's possible without complicating the Iranian crisis. Option: Pretend his statement in favor of two states is a new position (it's in fact a reiteration of his detailed position before in more or less the same terms) but point out that his terms (his substance) would make impossible what he now says he favors. In other words, catch his transparently false and hypocritical ploy not as false and hypocritical but as a contradiction in its own terms. Sid

Is this another Iranian revolution? <<http://www.opposingviews.com/articles/video-video-of-iran-riots-police-fire-on-protesters>>

To someone who has watched and studied the Iranian revolution of 1979 with fascination, developments in Iran today have an eerie reminiscence. Then there were massive protests that filled the streets, often marching in dignified but ominous silence; there was bloodshed as nervous security men with guns faced determined but unarmed crowds; there were sullen mourning parades; there were catchy chants and ritual calls of "Down with the shah!"; at night the rooftops rang with shouts of allahu akbar.

You need only change "shah" to "dictator," and you have a description of what is happening in Iran today.

But there is one very big difference. Thirty years ago, Iran had a charismatic cleric named Ayatollah Khomeini who had a refined sense of strategy and a willingness to risk everything for the cause he represented. On the other side was Mohammed Reza Shah, who had been on the throne for some 37 years and who commanded one of the most powerful military and security regimes in the world. On the surface it appeared to be an uneven battle – guns against turbans – but the ruler with the guns wavered and the turbans grew in size and confidence until the old order collapsed.

Today the nominal leader of the opposition forces is a reformed radical, Mir Hossein Mousavi, who is notably lacking in personal charisma. On the other side is the constitutional Leader, Ayatollah Khamene'i, who is widely perceived as a cautious political animal with limited qualifications for his religious post and who compensates for his own lack of charisma by manipulation of the political system and the institutions most loyal to him – particularly the politically minded clergy and the powerful security forces, including the Revolutionary Guards.

Neither of these men seems to be fully in control of their own forces, let alone the situation. The fraudulent election defeat of Mousavi was a triggering event, but the energy behind these unprecedented demonstrations is due more to the sense of outrage and betrayal at the gross manipulation of numbers by the regime than it is about any undying devotion to Mousavi. Yesterday Mousavi ordered that people stay home in face of a conflicting pro-regime demonstration. They marched anyway (and the daughter of former president Rafsanjani joined them and urged them on). Mousavi then "ordered" everyone to march the following day (which they were probably going to do with or without his orders) Khamene'i announced the "divine assessment" of the election outcome – even before it would probably have been physically possible to count the more than 40 million ballots. Then, in the face of mass protests, he ordered an investigation of the results by the Guardian Council – the same organization that was responsible for managing the election in the first place. No one believed him in either case, and no one expected anything of importance from the Guardian Council. Khamene'i has ordered peace and reconciliation. No one paid any attention.

I deliberately did not mention president-elect Ahmadinejad. After celebrating his "victory," he went off to a largely symbolic meeting in Moscow. He seems to be out of the decision loop and more of a passive player than a major actor in these events.

So who is calling the shots? Mousavi seems to be running along after the crowd, not leading it. But that is probably all that is required to keep the protest in motion.

On the other side, the very little evidence we have suggests that the important decisions are being made by the ultra-conservative leadership of the Revolutionary Guards, whose political role has ballooned over the past decade, perhaps in cooperation with their extremist counterparts in the clergy. They are utterly ruthless and ideologically fueled.

New York Times columnist Nick Kristoff reminded us several days ago (see blog item on June 15 below) at the end of the

day, as I saw at Tiananmen 20 years ago, when Might and Right do battle, it's often prudent to bet on Might, at least in the short run.

The regime seems to have miscalculated badly. They seemed to believe that a sudden coup – the announcement of dramatic election results followed by a show of force – would intimidate and silence the opposition and consolidate their control. That is perhaps more understandable if the decisions were being made by military leaders who tend to see the battle in Manichaeian terms, rather than politicians such as Khamene'i who are accustomed to seeing shades of gray. In any event, it backfired and they now have a much larger crisis on their hands than if they had simply arranged for Ahmadinejad to win by a slim margin (which was at least believable).

All parties are now in uncharted territory. A significant portion of the Iranian population seems to have concluded that their social contract with the rulers – accepting Islamic rule in return for a respectful regard for the opinion of the governed, an Islamic Republic – is no longer valid. They do not trust their rulers.

The rulers, whose support has been declining for years in the face of their own inept management of the country, are increasingly replacing popular support with repression. This election seems to have called that tactic into question. For the military, the obvious answer is more repression. So it would appear to be a moment to bet on Might.

But nobody is fully in command of events. Decisions taken in the next weeks will be fateful and could determine the future path of the Iranian revolution.

There is another lesson as Iran's leaders contemplate a Tiananmen moment. When the Tiananmen crackdown occurred almost exactly ten years ago, one of the leaders of China at the time was Zhao Ziyang, General Secretary of the Communist Party. He was later fired and placed under house arrest. His smuggled memoirs have just appeared, revealing the depth of disagreements within the leadership about how to proceed.

Is it possible that ten years from now we will have a volume describing the intense debates that one can only presume are underway today in the highest councils of the Islamic Republic of Iran?

Day of Mourning, Protests, Called by Mousavi on Thursday

Mir-Hosain Mousavi, who maintains he won last Friday's presidential election despite official assertions that he lost 2 to 1 to Mahmoud Ahmadinejad, is calling for another rally Thursday <<http://english.aljazeera.net/news/middleeast/2009/06/200961821430303166.html>> , this time in part to honor the persons killed by hardliners or security forces in the course of previous demonstrations.

Mourning the martyr is as central to Iranian Shiite religious culture as it was to strains of medieval Catholicism in Europe, and Mousavi's camp is tapping into a powerful set of images and myths here. The archetypal Shiite martyr is Imam Husayn, the grandson of the Prophet Muhammad, who championed oppressed Muslims in Iraq and was cut down by the then Umayyad Muslim Empire. Recognition that a Muslim state might commit the ultimate in sacrilege by beheading a person who had been dangled on the Prophet's knee has imbued modern political Shiism with a distrust of the state. When Husayn's head was brought to the Umayyad caliph Yazid and deposited before his throne, older companions of the Prophet are said to have wept and remarked, "I saw the Prophet's lips on those cheeks." Shiites ritually march, flagellate, and chant in honor of the martyred Imam or divinely-appointed leader.

Today's protesters are wearing green, which symbolizes Mousavi's descent from the Prophet Muhammad. (Mousavi's family name refers to the Seventh Imam (descendant of the Prophet with claims to divine knowledge), Musa Kazim, whose tomb is in Kazimiya, north Baghdad. Sayyid families, those claiming descent from the Prophet, often take one of the Imams' names as a family name to honor them, though of course they are also claiming descent from the previous Imams right back to the Prophet.) The repertoires of protest the reformists are using echo those of the 1978-79 Islamic Revolution— they are chanting "God is Great," mourning pious fallen martyrs, etc.— another sign that this movement is not just alienated secularized elites.

But now Mousavi's his supporters are also sporting black ribbons to indicate that they are in mourning for the fallen. Typically, the dead will be commemorated again at one month and at 40 days. In 1978 such demonstrations for those killed in previous demonstrations grew in size all through the year, till they reached an alleged million in the streets of Tehran. Since the reformists are already claiming Monday's rally was a million, you wonder where things will go from here.

The regime's attempt to paint the protesters as nothing more than US intelligence agents <http://news.yahoo.com/s/ap/20090617/ap_on_re_mi_ea/ml_iran_election> underlines how wise President Obama has been not to insert himself forcefully into the situation in Iran. The reformers and the hard liners are not stable groupings. The core of each is competing for the allegiance of the general Iranian public. If the reformers can convince most Iranians of the justice of their cause, they will swing behind the opposition. If the hard liners can convince the public that the reformers are nothing more than cat's paws of a grasping, imperialist West— i.e. that they are Ahmad Chalabis trying to bring Iran foreign occupation so as to get power themselves— then the reformists will be crushed. Iranians value national independence above all, having suffered with a CIA-installed government for decades in the mid-twentieth century.

The prescriptions of John McCain and Faux Cable news for muscular US diplomacy at this point are tone deaf to Iranian realities and would backfire big time, harming both the reform cause and US interests. Anyway, after the basket case to which the US Republican Party reduced Iraq, no one in the global South is likely to want them meddling in their internal affairs.

Reports are streaming in of the arrest of over a hundred opposition figures and of hard line militia men following protesters home and breaking into their homes to terrorize them. See e.g., Basij paramilitary forces terrorize residential complex <<http://www.payvand.com/news/09/jun/1164.html>> . The Basij militiamen are said to be afraid to come out in numbers during the opposition demonstrations, but sneak around at night to trail protesters and harass or arrest them.

Supreme Leader Ali Khamenei had met Tuesday morning with the representatives of all four presidential candidates <<http://www.chicagotribune.com/news/nationworld/chi-tc-nw-iran-0617-0618jun18,0,2404153.story>> , urging them to make up but continuing to insist that Ahmadinejad was the winner by 24 million to 14 million votes. He portrayed the massive post-election demonstrations and charges of ballot fraud as a minor tiff.

Gary Sick wonders if Khamenei really is the supreme leader any more <<http://garysick.tumblr.com/post/125605556/is-this-another-iranian-revolution>> , and hints that the hard line tack of stealing the election was directed by the Iranian Revolutionary Guard Corps, the country's religious national guard.

Reports are coming in from Iran that allege that the regime is tracking down and destroying satellite dishes, using helicopters for aerial surveillance of neighborhoods and Basij, the right wing militia (sort of like Mussolini's Black Shirts) to do the breaking and entering. Kindly neighbors who have tried to warn suspected satellite dish owners that the militiamen were coming have sometimes reportedly themselves been arrested.

With regard to the new media initiatives we are developing, we are working in this start-up phase with KIT Digital, which has made a commitment of \$150,000 of in-kind digital-services to us; Soliya, a non-profit pioneer in the use of the latest technologies to link university students in the US and Europe with their peers in predominantly Muslim countries; and we have a founding partnership with YouTube and excellent relations at the senior executive level at Google. In the film industry we have a commitment from Participant Media - the leading production studio of films for social change - of up to \$100 million of matching funds for film productions that advance mutual understanding and human security between Western and Muslim populations. Purpose of Trip

From April 5-7, 2009, I attended the 2nd Forum of the U.N. Alliance of Civilization (AOC) in Istanbul, Turkey. The primary purpose of the trip was to learn more about the AOC and examine whether the United States should join the AOC Group of Friends as a tool to further U.S. engagement with the Muslim world. The secondary purpose was to meet civil society leaders from Muslim countries and broaden our network of contacts in the Muslim world.

Key Findings

The Forum provided an important networking platform for leaders from Muslim and Western countries to discuss common issues and share solutions. Over 1,000 mayors, foreign ministers, religious leaders, media, academics, NGOs, and civil society leaders from different countries convened to discuss shared challenges in areas of education, media, migration, and youth. Unlike most UN forums where debate is scripted in advance, the Alliance of Civilizations Forum allowed for more free flowing and less rehearsed conversation (though not necessarily during the plenary sessions).

The Alliance launched a number of new initiatives during the Forum such as the Dialogue Café, which links diverse groups of citizens from around the world through third generation video-conferencing technology, and the Alliance Research Network, which is a group of institutions that will serve as a collective think-tank for the Alliance and be the leaders of a movement to encourage cross-cultural educational exchange.

From the U.S. perspective, the Alliance of Civilizations can be a useful venue to meet with leading reformers and thinkers in the greater Muslim world, a platform not often offered to the United States. During the conference, I had an opportunity to network with young and seasoned government and

civil society leaders from Saudi Arabia and other Gulf states, Indonesia, Turkey, Pakistan, and Iran. I was impressed with how hopeful people were of a serious change in U.S. policy under President Obama towards the Muslim world and signs of credible and peaceful U.S. leadership. The conference did not generate into anti-U.S. or anti-Israel bashing as was the fear among some, even with the active participation of Iran under President Khatami's leadership. If anything, it would have greatly benefited more active participation from the United States, Israel, and other Western countries, including representation from our Embassy and/or Consulate General. Only a handful of Americans participated in the conference, mainly from NGOs. I was the only representative from the U.S. government to attend. Most countries' delegations were led by heads of state or foreign ministers.

The Forum took place during the same time as President Obama's visit to Turkey and Istanbul. While President Obama did not attend the Forum, he did meet with high-level participants on the sidelines to discuss broader engagement with the Muslim world, which was appreciated by the participants.

Recommendations

The United States should consider joining the Alliance "Group of Friends." The Group of Friends includes over 100 countries and international organizations (including most Muslim countries, many Latin American countries, Canada, and many European countries including France and the United Kingdom) that support the efforts of the Alliance of Civilizations to counter the rise of extremism and polarization. While the Alliance is still in its nascent stages, if steered in the right direction, it can be a positive tool for the United States in reaching out to the broader Muslim world. It has already launched concrete projects in the fields of youth, media, education, and migration that show signs of promise.

The United States should actively participate at the next Forum to be held in Brazil in 2010. There should high-level representation from the U.S. Embassy, and the U.S. government should support active participation from U.S. NGOs, religious leaders, youth, academics, media, and civil society leaders.

The State Department and U.S. Congress should work actively with the Alliance to support the Alliance's many creative projects aimed at bridging the divide between the West and the Muslim world and combating extremism. These include the Alliance Media Fund which expands the production of entertaining film, television, and new media content that challenges common stereotypes and exposes audiences to more-balanced representations of regions and cultures that are often ignored or negatively portrayed in mass media.

Background

The Alliance of Civilization was established in 2005, at the initiative of the Governments of Spain and Turkey, under the auspices of the United Nations. A High-level Group of experts was formed by former Secretary-General Kofi Annan to explore the roots of polarization between societies and cultures today and to recommend a practical program of action to address this issue. The Report of the High-level Group provided analysis and put forward practical recommendations that form the basis for the implementation plan of the Alliance of Civilizations. On April 26, 2007, former President of Portugal, Jorge Sampaio, was appointed as the High Representative for the AOC by Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon to lead the implementation phase of the Alliance. The first Alliance of Civilizations Forum was held in Spain in 2008.

The AoC Secretariat, which is based in New York, works in partnership with States, international and regional organizations, civil society groups, foundations, and the private sector to mobilize concerted efforts to promote cross-cultural relations among diverse nations and communities. Its four main focus areas are education, media, migration, and youth.

I cannot claim credit for many of these partnerships and commitments as I inherited most of them from Omar and my Board when I stepped in as Executive Director, but I do see a real window of opportunity to bring these and other relationships to the table to help meet some of the challenges identified by President Obama and Secretary Clinton – and I have a strategy in mind for how to do this that I'd like to discuss with you.

As noted yesterday, I would welcome the opportunity to meet with you in DC next Monday or at another day and time that is convenient for you – there or in New York where I am based.

Also – FYI - the next public event we will do in DC will be in early October. The US Institute of Peace is hosting an event for us during which one of the Harvard lab researchers we have supported will present and discuss – together with our Advisory Board member HM Queen Noor and myself – on the impact of visual media on intergroup relations. The target audience will be public diplomacy policy-makers, media for social change practitioners and funders, and think tanks dealing with US relations with the Muslim World. Once the date is set we will make sure you are alerted on the off-chance that you might be available to attend yourself or might be willing to propose others who we should invite. Of course, I hope we will have already had the chance to meet before then.

U.S. can't squander the trust of Israells

Is the United States still Israel's best friend?

That is a question I never thought would be on the lips of Americans and Israelis because, for my entire life, these two great democracies have had an inextricable relationship — one based on common goals and common values — that, though strained from time to time, was never questioned.

So, why now? Why are Americans — Jews and non-Jews — asking the question about America's commitment to the Jewish state? And why are Israelis, for the first time, probably ever, so overwhelmingly convinced that the United States is prepared to abandon them?

The answer is simple: President Barack Obama. And in that answer lies a very complicated calculus that is creating justifiable consternation among people in both countries who believe that America and Israel must, should and always have to be best friends.

I wrote a few weeks ago, after the president's speech in Cairo, that had those same words been spoken in Israel or in the United States, descriptors such as "betrayal" would not be too harsh in defining the reaction of responsible people to what Obama was saying to the Muslim world. The president mangled history and tortured decades of written and unwritten assurances between our two countries to show the Muslim (which includes the Arab) world that he was trying to be

evenhanded in his search for the key to unlock the mysteries of a peace effort that has gone awry for the past 60 years.

I refused to pile on the president after that speech, mostly because I think I understand that part of the world and its religious adherence to the concept that words and deeds rarely need to match. In fact, rarely does what people say over there have much to do with what they actually mean or mean to do.

However, there is more to that story. And it is precisely that other part that is causing so much concern over our president's efforts to find a solution in the Middle East.

That other part can be summed up in one word — trust.

Israel, since its modern birth in 1948, has been able to trust just one country other than itself — the United States. The relationship built over the past six decades has been centered on the belief from the Israeli side that the United States would always support a secure Jewish state of Israel. And from the American side, Israel has always proven itself to be a courageous and trustworthy democratic ally in a part of the world that is vital to U.S. interests.

Other factors — cultural, democratic, political, religious — have cemented our relationship, but in the end, we are friends and we believe in each other because our interests are so similar. They could be us.

Over the years, the relationship has occasionally been strained, mostly because of a naivete on the American side about how life works in the Middle East or, more practically, because of an overpowering State Department bias toward the Arab states — because that's where the oil is.

That has manifested itself at least twice. In President Jimmy Carter's bungling of Egyptian President Anwar Sadat's peace initiative to Israel which, ultimately, ended with an Israeli-Egyptian peace treaty but missed the much larger pan-Arab accord that was in the offing. At the time, I thought the ham-handedness was based on a very naive view of the Middle East. Lately, the former president's actions and writings suggest much more sinister reasons.

Oil pressures worked against Israel in the late 1980s when an exasperated President George H.W. Bush took up the harshest of Arab positions and threatened Israel's lifeblood and lifeline — promised, inviolate commitments of U.S. foreign aid — because of the Jewish state's continued building of settlements in the West Bank. For the United States, they were a nuisance and an impediment to good relations with our oil suppliers. For Israel, at the time, they represented life-and-death security.

Those two obvious examples of relationship pressure notwithstanding, the bond between our two countries has been unshakable.

So, is it shaky now? Israelis think so. In a recent poll in Israel, an overwhelming majority of Israelis think Obama is the most unfriendly American president ever. That kind of attitude toward the United States feeds a growing insecurity in Israel about the heretofore unshakable U.S.-Israeli relationship. And that can all be explained by Obama's speech in Cairo and his demand for the end to all settlement activity — even the activity specifically agreed to by past U.S. administrations.

And, therein lies the rub. This can't be and is not about settlements. Most Israelis and most Americans don't understand why they are needed in 2010 — beyond a few that are major population centers and obvious security barriers to the terrorists that the Palestinian Authority is either incapable of stopping or unwilling to stop.

No, the issue is about trust. If the United States and President Obama can't be trusted to keep the word of presidents past, promises Israel relied upon when it agreed to the Road Map, when it unilaterally removed itself from Gaza (and has been rewarded for that move with murderous missiles ever since) and when it dismantled settlements at great political and personal peril — then how can it rely on this president when he says that tiny country's security will always be first and foremost to the United States?

Simply put, Israelis no longer trust the United States with their lives.

And therein lies the greatest danger to United States' interests in the Middle East. When push comes to shove between Israel and her Arab neighbors, and especially a nuclear-tipped Iran, who can Israel look to for its survival?

Only itself.

And that changes a calculus that has kept that part of the world from a conflagration for more than half a century.

I am still one of those people who believes President Obama is playing the "words not deeds" card as he tries to break the logjam in the Middle East. But he and Secretary of State Hillary Clinton have to know that kind of gamesmanship goes

only so far. By mouthing the Arab terrorists' mangled historical mantra — something I am certain they do not intend — they give a powerful aid and comfort to the bad guys' deadly goals.

And that won't last long in a part of our world where survival means acting first and acting hard.

Our president is walking and talking a thin edge on a very dangerous sword. He would be wise to make sure that those who need to trust him still can. On that score, there is much work to be done.

Let Bernardin's spirit guide Obama, pope

 Pro-choice President Obama goes to the Vatican next month to meet pro-life Pope Benedict.
 "The Vatican has been seeking common ground with Obama, although some American Catholic bishops have been hostile to his administration," the AP reported.
 Let's pray that the spirit of the late Cardinal Joseph Bernardin fills the room and that Cardinal Bernard Law, now assigned to Rome, is nowhere in sight.
 Bernardin and Obama, despite a deep difference on abortion, shared much: Chicago. A commitment to dialogue. And a belief that common ground can be found even across the most fractured fault lines of faith and belief.
 But it's treacherous territory.
 And what happened to Bernardin in the months before his death illuminates the land mines ahead -- both inside and outside the Catholic Church.
 In the summer of 1996, three months before pancreatic cancer claimed him, Bernardin quietly sent a document to his fellow bishops for review. He told them that in two weeks he would hold a news conference on its contents. But first he asked them to weigh in.
 The document, "Called To Be Catholic: Church in a Time of Peril," was the first official call for discussion among Catholics on polarizing issues including the role of women, human sexuality and abortion. And war, capital punishment and racial injustice.
 Though a few colleagues such as Cardinal Roger Mahony of Los Angeles lent their support, "Most bishops sat on their hands," recalled Monsignor Ken Velo, one of Bernardin's closest friends. "Law did not say anything at all."
 Then, on Aug. 13, the day Bernardin took his report public, Law sent out his own news release to denounce it. He called it "unfortunate" and said there could be no dialogue if it contested the truth of church teachings.
 A few months later, as Bernardin lay dying, Law called, hoping to see Bernardin. Velo left Bernardin's bedside to take the call.
 "He said," Velo recalled, "I'm thinking of coming to Chicago."
 Velo was blunt. He told Law that Bernardin "had a difficult time" with what Law had done. And he conveyed the dying cardinal's disappointed words. Bernardin, referring to Law by his first name said, "I would never have done this to Bernie."
 Law, according to Velo, denied he had done anything hurtful. But we now know Law is well-practiced in the art of denial. A pedophile scandal engulfed his diocese and the nation, forced his resignation in 2002 and sent him into exile in Rome. Amazingly, Law remains a prince of the church -- and lives like one.
 At Bernardin's funeral in the winter of 1996, Law was the senior bishop on the altar, but it was Mahony whom Bernardin designated to say his mass, and Velo whom he asked to give his homily.
 "There was a righteous anger in me," acknowledged Velo. And there was anger among those in the pews that day, who burst into applause when Velo, from the pulpit, said of Bernardin: "He took initiatives. He had a hard time with people who

directed lives by using rearview mirrors. He wanted people to come around the table and see, not what divides us, but what brings us together. He wanted to make common ground, holy ground."

From the political wars in Springfield, Illinois, to the battlefields of Iraq to the bloody streets of Iran, the cry for common ground screams out at us.

Pope Benedict's meeting with President Obama sends an urgently needed signal. Especially since Bishop John D'Arcy, whose diocese includes Notre Dame University, boycotted Obama's appearance at graduation in South Bend in May. If Darcy had shown up, he and Obama could have talked. Not agreed, but opened a dialogue. The way the pope and the president will in July.

The way Cardinal Bernardin on the eve of his death believed all of us must to survive.

NEW INFORMATION

About 45 minutes ago, Telesur had images of apparent pro-Zelaya supporters at the airport fence and trying to pull it down. Security forces inside the airport compound re-deployed to prevent a breach. It seems they did use white smoke or gas to deter protestor action. Telesur also reported that shots were fired into the assembled crowd and that one or two people were shot and killed (no names or confirmation). Images of ambulances in crowd were visible.

It seems now that the fence has been breached and a handful of pro-Zelaya supporters move in and out of airport area to pick up rocks and retreat (there is open, clear area inside fence, possible construction). Security forces have taken up positions on tarmac, presumably to prevent further incursion.

With respect to Micheleti assertion that NIC troops have mobilized near the border, our NIC contacts, both in GON and private citizens indicate that there has been NO/NO unusual NIC mil activity at border -- Las Manos or El Espino. However, as of 1900 Saturday, border contacts at El Espino report that HOND military reinforced its presence by about 70 personnel, who remain at El Espino. We were told this happened at Las Manos as well, but have not yet been able to confirm with our sources at that border location.

Will continue to monitor and observe.

I. INTRODUCTION

I welcome this opportunity to speak with you about President Obama's foreign policy and the approach his administration is taking to pursue our national interests, to advance our values, and to exercise American leadership in seizing the opportunities and meeting the challenges of our time. For the past six months, President Obama has been laying the foundation of a foreign policy that meets the demands of the 21st century. Today, I want to offer some thoughts on the strategic architecture we seek to build – our objectives, our priorities, and our ways and means of achieving them.

While I will address several fundamental questions, let me underscore our commitment that the Obama administration will restore a sense of purpose in the use of American influence and power that serves both our national security interests and our promotion of democratic solution with our allies and partners. We will use all of the tools in our national security toolbox: diplomacy, intelligence, economic incentives (and disincentives as necessary), and the political and moral leadership that yielded so many successes in the 65 years since the end of World War II.

We have great opportunities before us if we will seize them as we have done in the past. The world is more closely linked than ever before. This is largely the result of our leadership in the creation of the United Nations and Bretton Woods institutions, stemming from the recognition of our leaders in their time that old institutions no longer met global needs. The spread of technology, the accelerating movement of information, and the interdependence of our economic and social relationships, all of which our economic system has fostered, have created a new world that tests our imagination as a global nation again. We are called once more to lead the way in creating new solutions to the new challenges of our national interest and the broader equilibrium in a potentially fractured global community.

The United States faces complex, varied, and numerous challenges, from military involvement in Afghanistan and Iraq to instability in Pakistan. A tense and fragile status quo in the Middle East. Nuclear threats from North Korea and Iran. An economic crisis that roils global markets, threatens regional stability, and costs jobs here at home. Transnational challenges amplified by global interdependence – failed and failing states, violent extremism, proliferation of weapons of mass destruction, weapons and narco-trafficking, resource depletion, energy insecurity and climate change. And urgent development demands, from extreme poverty to hunger to pandemic disease to fundamental human rights.

Our strategic goal is once again to position the United States of America to be able to exercise effective global leadership as we enter

an era in which the world needs global leadership more than ever before. Our common challenges – from violent extremism and climate change to the proliferation of nuclear weapons – call for coordinated international responses. Our interconnected problems require interconnected solutions. No country is better positioned to make those connections than the United States. This is so not just because of the easily quantifiable factors, like our share of global GDP and military might, but also because of the less tangible and arguably more important factors – the resonance of our ideas, the attractiveness of our example, and willingness of our people to stand up for others and not just ourselves.

American credibility is being renewed because our capacity for democracy is being renewed. Our policies are not simply reactive to inherited crises of the recent decade. The new realities of the 21st century will not yield to unilateralism, anger, polemics, or impulse. A split vision view of the modern world produces disorientation.

The clearly structured world of the late 20th century is giving way to a new multi-dimensional global environment. Simple solutions and rigid frameworks are counter-productive because not only do they fail to reflect reality but they also create friction against it. The age of a few great powers settling the fate of the world is long past. As President Obama recently said:

Both gain and risk have now become global. There is nowhere to hide from danger. But there is also no place on earth where progress cannot in time prevail. Just as the challenges are ever-present, our capacity to meet them is expanding. As a nation and people we stand not only on our past successes, but on the beliefs, diversity and visions that have underpinned those successes. We are well prepared for the new era that demands global leadership. And the most important well-spring of our power in the world is the willingness of the American people to embrace change, its hopes as well as its burdens.

President Obama has committed our nation to think outside of old categories. He is ready to talk with adversaries, reduce nuclear arsenals, open dialogues with diverse peoples. He understands that America cannot do this alone. We are already seeking new patterns of cooperation, of partnership to find common ground.

(Cite here, if you wish, recent successes: framework for nuclear arms reduction with Russia, jump starting the Middle East peace process, we are withdrawing US combat forces from Iraq in the confidence that Iraqis can protect their security, etc.)

Our traditional alliances are more valuable than ever. But we are reaching out to forge new partnerships to meeting the challenges ranging from climate change to immigration, from the emergence of renegade non-state actors to food security, narco-trafficking, human trafficking.

We will build upon and redefine traditional alliances that have been frayed at the edges. The greatest partnership in the history of the world is the Atlantic alliance. But it is based on institutions created by the alliance immediately after World War II. We are now one democratic community of nearly a billion people reaching from Estonia in the East to Alaska in the West. Democracies now ring the globe from New Delhi to Seoul, from Dar Es Salaam to Santiago. Our affinity with other democracies is based on shared values. We don't see them as resources but as essential partners in global progress. And together we will stand as firmly for progress in the 21st century as we did in the second half of the 20th. We will apply the same imagination and commitment to designing solutions now as we did in the aftermath of the catastrophic destruction after World War II.

Globalization--technology, trade and finance--did not create a self-perpetuating model. It never has done so. After the collapse of the world order in the Great Depression and World War II, a whole new system of arrangements, laws, rules, and partnerships was constructed to avoid the repetition of disaster and to insure equilibrium for peace and prosperity. We are in a similar moment when the old order has proved inadequate in managing new realities that have fostered new crises—and now new architecture must be built. Once again diplomacy as essential statecraft is required. The world has faced decades of change—and we face new decades of uncertain and unsettling radical change. How we shape the institutions and manage the rules of change now will determine its outcome in the future.

In order to achieve all that we can to protect our long-term security interests, we must have all that we need. At present, our civilian instruments of power—diplomacy and development—are inadequate complements to our military power. Our limited resources and manpower severely constrain our ability to respond to problems and to advance our affirmative foreign policy goals. Secretary of Defense Robert Gates has been at the forefront in recognizing that strengthening our diplomatic forces is necessary for our overall force structure. We must deploy the full diplomatic force that is required to fulfill a strategy for a secure peace.

Let me emphasize before I go on. Foes and would-be foes should understand that our focus on diplomacy strengthens our national security arsenal. They should never see it as a sign of weakness to be exploited. We will not hesitate to defend our friends and ourselves vigorously when necessary with the world's strongest and most lethal military. This is not an option we seek, but it is also not a threat—it is a promise.

We have witnessed episodes of both the naivete and the arrogance of power. But American leadership has been most effective when we have practiced the pragmatism of our purposes, the pragmatism of power, our means not undermining our ends, but our methods advancing our interests and ideals.

We propose a strategy to secure peace and rebuild prosperity. We recognize the imperfections of our system, and that recognition is perhaps our greatest asset, because within it is contained the impulse for improvement, for learning from our mistakes, for developing

as a wiser nation among nations as a result of our experience. There are some who say that self-correction shows weakness. I suppose they believe that repeating error is a sign of strength, though it's actually the definition of neurosis. We are told by the philosopher Santayana that those who do not learn from history are condemned to repeat it. For nations, as for individuals, learning from the past is the path to wisdom.

So we have our work cut out for us. In pursuing solutions to global problems that advance our interests and promote our values, we are resisting doctrinaire approaches in favor of a calm, principled, pragmatic strategic framework that sets out in clear and simple terms the ends we seek to achieve and the approach we'll use to achieve them.

II. THE ENDS

Our foreign policy, our strategy, seeks to build the world we want and not simply defend against the world we fear. Of course, our first and most fundamental objective must always be to ensure the security of the American people and our allies. We have a basic duty—pledged by every generation—to exercise American leadership wisely and effectively in confronting the great challenges of our time. But we must go further. We must also pursue an affirmative strategy to expand opportunity and prosperity around the globe so that more people in more places can live up to their God-given potential.

This agenda comes from the heart of our values and our interests. Greater opportunity for others means greater prosperity here at home and greater security for all. Giving people the incentives and means to belong to a global community will lead to less conflict and more cooperation. At the same time, our strategy projects the core of what America represents—a land of opportunity, where people are free to pursue their dreams and become capable to do so.

This agenda will be ambitious, responsible, and practical. We will help societies strengthen the building blocks of economic growth. We will expand the number of quality jobs and enhance people's capacity to earn a good living and provide for their families. We will work toward the eradication of preventable diseases, and to make hunger temporary and rare and not endemic. We will seek to create conditions where every child has access to education, housing and health care, and where all citizens have basic universal rights and freedoms. On this foundation of human potential, the world can build greater peace, progress, and prosperity.

Central to this effort is building not just the capacity of people but the capacity of governments. So we will place a special emphasis on fostering and supporting democracy that delivers. We believe that democracy is about more than the ballot box—and that democracy can only succeed in practice if democratic institutions and governments can meet the needs of the people they represent. By the same token, we believe that people can best meet their potential where their governments create conditions for opportunity to thrive. So we will bring all of tools at our disposal to bear in supporting governments that respond to and are accountable to their people; governments that respect the rights of, and deliver results for, their people.

Freedom and democracy are our highest values, but they have in the eyes of some become tainted because they are thought to be hypocritical, mere words used to justify actions the opposite of their real meaning—freedom and democracy imposed by a great power that insists other people must be exactly like us. That distortion has become the essence of anti-Americanism in the world today. But the skewed perception is not the reality. Whether in Latin America or Lebanon, or Iran, people who are inspired by democracy, and adapt them to their own traditions and circumstances, will find that Americans are their friends, not adversaries. America is always the well-wisher of independence, freedom and democracy wherever it emerges, in any corner of the globe.

(If you wish, here is where you can say something concrete on Iran here: release political prisoners, call for ICRC to be allowed to inspect and monitor, etc. Call regime "military government of Iran." Etc.)

Given the range, complexity, diversity, and above all, the interconnectedness of the challenges we face, we don't have the luxury to focus these efforts narrowly. We cannot succeed on one challenge without making progress on others. So we have to walk and chew gum at the same time. Call it diplomatic multi-tasking—not for lack of focus, but because we intend to confront every significant problem and at the same time ensure that opportunities don't slip by.

That is why I have advocated for the appointment of special envoys. Special envoys can devote full-time energy to a particular region or issue, while the President and I can provide clear guidance and direction across the strategic landscape that encompasses multiple challenges.

Even in a multi-dimensional world in which we must multi-task, we must also set concrete priorities, and fashion a comprehensive strategy to address them all simultaneously. A few major priorities will shape our foreign policy.

First, to counter violent extremism wherever we find it—in Afghanistan and Pakistan, Iraq, the Middle East, and in weak and failed states. Violent extremism poses a direct and deliberate challenge to the global community. It threatens the American people and our allies, undermines regional stability, and thwarts progress in too many societies and for too many people.

For a moment let's revisit 9/11 and rethink what happened and draw lessons from a deeper understanding. The terrorist attacks were the worst ever to take place on American soil—but they were an attack on more than our own country. I know. I was the senator from New York. I stood at Ground Zero in the immediate aftermath. The victims were people from all over the world, of many nationalities,

and all religions, including many Muslims. 9/11 was an attack on the idea of a progressive international order--on the rule of law, not arbitrary authority; on economic opportunity, not rigid caste and class distinctions; and on democracy, not absolutism. This was not and is not a clash of civilizations; it was and remains a plot against civilization--and not just Western civilization. Violent extremists in the years since 9/11 have proved their limited appeal. They are not the tide of the future, they are desperate nihilists who want to prevent Muslims from moving into a better, more just and peaceful future.

And so we must work to make violent extremists an increasingly feeble and marginal force in our global community. Among other things, we will cooperate with Muslim communities across the globe to confront these small bands of extremists, to promote opportunities for progress, and to create conditions for peace in unstable regions. In pursuing this cooperation, however, we have to be clear that our common fight against extremists is only part of our shared agenda.

Second, we seek to curb the proliferation of weapons of mass destruction and work toward -- as the President stated in his speech in Prague -- a world without nuclear weapons. There is no greater threat to the American people -- or to global peace and progress -- than the spread of nuclear weapons. Along the way to global zero, we will take a number of concrete steps. We will work with Russia to secure meaningful reductions in our nuclear stockpiles through a START II agreement. We will confront the nuclear ambitions of North Korea and Iran, and offer each a reasonable but non-negotiable choice: comply with your obligations and abandon your efforts to build nuclear weapons or face continued international isolation and sanctions. We will seek to strengthen and expand the nuclear non-proliferation regime, create a global nuclear fuel bank, and work with the Senate to ratify the CTBT. Our agenda is ambitious but achievable, and we are already hard at work.

Third, we will combat climate change, pursue greater energy security, and lead the world toward a clean energy future. We will work to reduce the threat of a warming planet and mitigate its harmful effects, which are already being experienced in economic, political, and human terms around the world. We also have a strong security interest in developing stable and affordable energy supplies, and we intend to build more effective partnerships toward that end -- with our suppliers, with transit countries, and with those who share our commitment to new clean technologies. In the short-term, our efforts on climate change and energy security will run on parallel tracks, but in the long term they lead to the same place: a clean energy future that protects the planet, enhances regional stability, and creates broad-based economic opportunity.

And fourth, we will enhance human security by reducing poverty and hunger, and promoting health, education, fundamental human rights, and empowerment, particularly for women and girls who so often serve as drivers of economic growth as well as social stabilizers. Poverty, hunger, poor health, inadequate education and limited freedoms contribute to political instability and undermine economic progress. They give rise to ungoverned spaces too easily filled by violent extremists. We will focus on improving the material conditions of people's lives, providing them opportunities to secure good jobs and a better future for their families, and enhancing their governments' capacity to deliver for them and holding their governments accountable to them. To this end, we will undertake a comprehensive reform of our foreign assistance and development policies, programs, and structures, and we will make the advancement of basic human rights a basic element of our foreign policy.

III THE WAYS

These priorities -- especially combating violent extremism, ending nuclear proliferation, addressing climate change and energy insecurity, enhancing human security -- are the focus of our foreign policy. But good intentions are not enough; we must have the means to achieve them.

Our fundamental approach will be to build -- or in some cases help others build -- coalitions of partners and lead them -- or support others in leading them -- against shared challenges and in service of shared objectives. We will aggressively enlist our historic allies, but we will not stop there. This will require three-dimensional diplomacy. We will build partnerships with a wide range of nations, non-state actors, and citizens. All will be offered the opportunity to participate in a new global network of partnerships, and all will be called upon to shoulder their fair share of the burden.

This is obviously a different approach from what we have pursued in the past. In the 19th century, many advocated a concert of powers, in which a few powerful states dictated terms to the rest. For much of the 20th Century, especially during the Cold War, during the bipolar contest, American leaders and strategists embraced a foreign policy strategy rooted in the "balance of power." Then in the years after the fall of the Berlin Wall we faced a strategic crossroads. With a unique combination of economic, political, and military superiority, it was tempting to pursue a strategy of primacy, in which some thought the U.S. could fulfill its goals unilaterally. Some others believed that with the Cold War over, international institutions would somehow step up to solve our problems for us and America's global responsibilities could recede.

Global politics is no longer characterized by the two-dimensional chessboard of a global balance of power. Nor can it be defined by American primacy maintained by unilateralism, nor by unbridled optimism about one-world unity.

Power still matters in our 21st century world -- as much as ever -- and the times call for a new strategy to build and use our power. The threats we face are more numerous and more unpredictable than at any time in our history. Some have the potential to kill millions of Americans and fundamentally change our way of life. No one nation, no matter how powerful, can address all those challenges at once, no one nation can defeat those threats alone. Indeed, in many cases, even groups of nations will need help from non-governmental organizations and citizens to achieve our common goals.

At the same time, no major global problem can be solved with the absence of the United States of America. So the question is, how best to lead toward solutions? I believe that the most effective way to exercise American leadership is not by retreating from the clamor of a multi-polar world, but by leveraging power to build a multi-partner community. By cultivating a world of strong, diverse and capable partners, we will improve our capacity to advance and secure our national interests and objectives. We will strengthen the networks of governments, non-governmental organizations and citizens that will join us in solving common problems. And we will make it far more difficult for other states to shirk their global responsibilities. In sum, a leveraging approach, built on three-dimensional diplomacy, empowers those who want to cooperate with us and constrains those who want to compete with us.

This kind of strategy will also best enhance the role of our leadership because it plays to America's strengths. We are the most diverse, globally connected, and versatile power in the world. We have extraordinary and unique convening power. It takes the United States to convene a group of affected nations to decide on and implement action against pirates in the Indian Ocean and nuclear suppliers everywhere. As a dispute resolver as well, the United States has long played a trusted and vital role, bringing parties together and providing services as an honest broker and peacemaker.

Throughout our history, many partnerships have evolved naturally to meet the circumstances we face. We must now pursue a world of partners much more systematically as a strategy, as the 21st century alternative to containment, isolationism, or power balancing. In doing so, we have to remember that one size does not fit all – our partner coalitions will be sized and shaped according to the specific challenge at hand. Some coalitions will be global; some regional. Some are permanent, some time-bound. Some are institutionalized, some not. Some are with states, some with non-state actors. We see many different coalitions of partners for many different purposes and we affirmatively reject a vision in which the world is run by a G-2, a G-8, or even a G-20. [This is the essence of three-dimensional diplomacy.]

Building the partnerships that form the foundation of this strategy takes steady patience and relentless diplomatic spadework – and it is at the heart of our daily foreign policy efforts. It starts with our enduring partnerships with core allies in Europe and Asia and North America. In recent years, many of our ties with these partners have been tested, and in some cases strained. We are working to reinforce, re-invigorate, and where necessary, repair these relationships.

We are also placing special emphasis on a set of evolving partnerships taking on a new shape in the 21st century. Here I speak of our relationships with growing global powers India and Brazil, and pivotal regional powers including Turkey, Indonesia, Mexico, and South Africa. More than ever before, these strong and capable states share common interests and values with us and we should encourage them to play greater roles in solving global problems.

At the same time, we are taking great care to manage and improve our emerging partnerships with China and Russia. With both, we will seek to cooperate to advance common interests – and to expand areas of cooperation – while standing firm on our principles and speaking candidly about our differences. It is imperative that we strive for a future of cooperation, without illusion that it can be done quickly or without bumps in the road.

Harnessing the major global powers – China, Russia, Brazil, and India – to be full partners in meeting the new global challenges will be a key priority – and a focus of my tenure. We will work to integrate them into the international system, and to expand our areas of common interest and common values.

And finally, but no less important, our partnership strategy must reach beyond governments – finding new and innovative ways to engage with non-governmental institutions, including the private sector, as well as citizens around the world. To do so, we must harness the power of new technologies and new means of connecting and communicating. Twitter and Facebook will become as much a part of the diplomatic lexicon as cables and demarches. President Obama and I have emphasized the need to engage people-to-people to foster greater understanding through cultural and educational exchanges and outreach. We will work with businesses to combine the efforts of the public and private sectors. And we will engage diaspora communities in the United States to engender political stability, economic ties, and cultural understanding across borders. By reaching out to and building partnerships with the people themselves, we will make our partnerships with the governments that serve them stronger and more durable. We will foster greater understanding and less mistrust. And we will also create networks to solve problems that governments cannot solve on their own.

Of course, not all states will be willing to participate in this world, at least not at first. Some will insist on defining their 21st century role in 19th and 20th century terms of amassing power to intimidate their neighbors, or to restore what they regard as their rightful historical empires. In such cases, we must work with partners to contain these strategies or to change their pursuers' calculus of costs and benefits.

To successfully lead the world in this way, we must restore America's credibility. As President Obama has made clear in both his words and actions, we will not ignore past mistakes. We will be honest about them. But we also will not be paralyzed by them. By ending torture and beginning to close the Guantanamo Bay detention facility, we already have acted to reverse policies that did not live up to our own values and damaged American credibility. We will also be straightforward about our shared responsibility for common problems – like drug trafficking in Mexico and our contribution to climate change. Some have equated an open accounting of our recent history – and an open acceptance of responsibility – with an apology. They are missing the point. When we hold ourselves accountable, we can hold others accountable as well. And our ability to hold ourselves and others accountable is a

fundamental strategic imperative in forging the effective coalitions we need to manage the problems of the future

IV. THE MEANS

Our approach incorporates a number of concrete strategies. The first is to lead with diplomacy, and cautiously engage our adversaries. We will pursue dialogue with countries with which we have differences— not as a reward, but as a method to solve problems, advance our national interests and secure peace. We cannot be afraid or unwilling to engage these nations, particularly if such engagement can advance our national interests. Dialogue creates the possibility for adversaries to respond, may lead to negotiations for acceptable resolutions and can develop information and insight about a regime. And by having reached out we are better positioned to build a coalition to bring pressure to bear. It is much harder for our partners to say no to tougher actions if we have exhausted the diplomatic route. For these reasons, we will continue to seek opportunities to engage when and where it is in our interests to do so, just as we did with the Soviet Union at the height of the Cold War.

One of my highest priorities as Secretary is to make development a strong pillar of American power. To achieve this, we have to think imaginatively to be effective, efficient and successful. Last week, I announced that we are undertaking a first-ever Quadrennial Diplomacy and Development Review, to explore how to design, fund, and implement development and foreign assistance.

Our goal is more agile, responsive and creative institutions of development. We will build broader partnerships with non-governmental organizations, multilateral institutions, the private sector, and other governments. We will focus on country-driven solutions, such as those at work with Haiti and on food security issues in Africa.

In Afghanistan, we're pursuing a civilian-led effort to promote alternative livelihoods, chiefly through agriculture. In Pakistan, we've responded decisively to the refugee crisis, and we're focused on increasing economic opportunity and delivering non-military assistance. In Iraq, the Strategic Framework Agreement – which sets out our non-military cooperation – is a central part of our strategy for ensuring a stable, sovereign, self-reliant Iraq. In the Middle East, we are focused on boosting the Palestinian Authority and we ask Israel to adhere to its commitments on settlements and improve conditions on the ground in the West Bank. In all of these places, development policy is crucial to transitions from conflict to peace, from instability to sustainable progress. In order to modernize the global strategic architecture, we will pursue the flexible, creative and cost-effective approaches to international and regional institutions. Too often they are encumbered by outdated protocols. We will reform multilateral institutions to reflect the emerging realities of the 21st century so they can quickly respond to immediate crises as well as long-term problems. We will pay particular attention to updating regional security architecture in Asia and Europe and elsewhere – a task we have too long neglected.

We will also emphasize the importance of a strong economy at home to our strength and leadership abroad, especially at this time of economic turmoil. This is not a traditional priority for a Secretary of State, but I will pursue recovery and growth as a basic pillar of our global leadership. Our economic power must be restored as a vital instrument of our strategy around the world. We will work to ensure that economic statecraft – trade and investment, debt forgiveness, loan guarantees, technical assistance – augments our policy objectives.

Finally, I am determined as one of my highest priorities as Secretary of State is to insure that the men and women of our Foreign and Civil Service have the resources they need to implement this ambitious agenda effectively and safely. Just as we would never deny ammunition to American troops headed into battle, we cannot send our diplomats into the field in today's world with all of the threats they face, 24/7, without the tools they need. If we don't invest in diplomacy and development, we will end up paying more for conflict and chaos. Diplomacy is indispensable as an instrument of U.S. national security interest—and always has been since Benjamin Franklin, Thomas Jefferson and John Adams secured support for our nation's independence.

V. THE CONCLUSION

Here at the dawn of a new millennium, we are both witness to and makers of momentous change.

But in the midst of tumult, we are not passive observers. We aspire to a world free of violent extremism, nuclear weapons, global warming, scarce energy, hunger, poverty, and disease.

We desire economic stability and prosperity. Clean and affordable energy. Health care, housing and education for our children. A flourishing of fundamental rights around the world.

The architecture of our foreign policy will enable us to advance all these goals. The new global network of diverse partnerships that we seek to create will be rooted in the belief that America will rise alongside other nations as allies and partners, demonstrating respect and winning respect.

We do not choose the fantasy of an isolated America, even if it were possible. Nor do we choose the fantasy of an Imperial America, a dangerous nation, a rugged individualist going it alone in the Wild West or Wild East. An isolated America cannot preserve our values, including our sovereignty. The lesson of the 20th century, in which we fought three world wars, including the Cold War, the long twilight struggle, is that we prevailed because our leadership was able to organize the preponderant power of the world behind our purposes. An Imperial America could not dominate the world or long control it. Its arrogance would only arouse hostility, resistance and resentment, becoming a source of alienation among our friends and grist for our enemies. America is now a modern

global nation. And America is called again to global leadership. There have been global nations before us. The British Empire was global in scope. But America was the first non-imperial, non-colonial global nation, and after World War II, we had credibility because we had no colonial legacy and supported the independence and freedom of nations, sometimes putting us at odds with our allies. We were and are a revolutionary nation. Who we are matters in the world. It has mattered since the beginning. It will always matter. Our ideals, born in the 18th century, give us credibility as a global nation in the 21st. It is the secret of our power of renewal, the energy source of our credibility in the world today. "We have it within our power to start the world over again," said Thomas Paine. And that is as true now as it was then.

This is the purpose of our foreign policy – the pursuit of national security and international progress, of our ideals and interests. We have the strategy. We have the power. We have the leadership. And today we again enjoy credibility in the community of nations.

AGENCE FRANCE-PRESSE: Israeli Prime Minister .

Benjamin Netanyahu has determined "it made no sense" to press the U.S. for assistance, a senior Israeli official said.

I really don't get it. On June 14, less than a month after his meeting with President Obama, Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu gave one of the most comprehensive, thoughtful and highly personal speeches supporting the Israeli-Palestinian peace process of any Israeli prime minister in recent years, perhaps ever.

One would have thought his speech would have been big news in the U.S., Europe and elsewhere. Mr. Netanyahu for the first time clearly stated he would support a two-state solution, albeit with understandable requirements to guarantee

Israel's security, despite leaving a different impression during last month's U.S. visit.

Yet, the reaction of governments and media in the U.S. and Europe was the functional equivalent of a tree falling in the forest with no one listening. Where it was covered, the writing emphasized the cynical and focused on the half-empty, rather than the half-full, glass.

So let's take a closer look at what could turn out to be a very significant, game-changing speech. It can be divided, essentially, into four parts: personal, historic, diplomatic and economic.

The personal aspect of the speech deals with the issue of peace. At one point, Mr. Netanyahu spoke directly to the Palestinian people: "We want to live with you in peace, as good neighbors. We want our children and your children to never again experience war: that parents, brothers and sisters will never again know the agony of losing loved ones in battle; that our children will be able to dream of a better future and realize that dream; and that together we will invest our energies in plowshares and pruning hooks, not swords and spears."

And then he reminded Palestinians that for him and his family, peace and war are quite personal: "I know the face of war. I have experienced battle. I lost close friends. I lost a brother. I have seen the pain of bereaved families. I do not want war. No one in Israel wants war."

Mr. Netanyahu also spent time in his speech on history, but not to relitigate the ancient argument over who lived in Palestine first or for the longest time. Rather, Mr. Netanyahu explained that the "root of the conflict" has been based on a fundamental misstatement of undeniable historical facts.

Palestinians have been taught that Israel was founded largely by alien foreigners, foisted on the native Palestinians by Europeans feeling guilty over the Holocaust. That misstatement has been the central rationale for Arab and Palestinian unwillingness to publicly recognize Israel as a Jewish state.

In fact, he points out, "the attacks against us began in the 1920s," 20 years before the Holocaust. And the undeniable historical fact is that "the Jewish people and the land of Israel go back over 3,500 years" - when Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, forefathers of all Jews; David and Solomon, ancient Israel's two greatest kings; and Isaiah and Jeremiah, two of the Jewish religion's greatest spiritual prophets, all lived in what was then Judea and Samaria, which today is called the West Bank.

"The right of the Jewish people to a state in the land of Israel does not derive from the cascade of catastrophes that befell our people," the prime minister said. "There are those who say that if the Holocaust had not occurred, the state of Israel would never have been established. But I say if the state of Israel would have been established earlier, it is the Holocaust that would not have occurred."

Third, the prime minister addressed the two simple requirements for peace between Israel and the Palestinians: recognition and security.

As to the first, he put it quite simply: "A fundamental prerequisite for ending the conflict is a public, binding and unequivocal Palestinian recognition of Israel as the nation-state of the Jewish people."

As to the security, it is also quite simple: Palestine must be demilitarized, as guaranteed by the international community, with open skies, no military alliances with hostile powers, and "effective security measures to prevent weapons smuggling into the territory - real monitoring, and not what occurs in Gaza today."

Once these two issues of recognition and security for Israel have been guaranteed, the rest of the difficult issues seem to come much easier: no more new settlements, with some wiggle room for the natural growth of current settlements caused by families growing; equitable treatment and assistance in placing refugees in land and homes outside of Israel (to preserve the essence of historic Israel as a Jewish state).

And on the always controversial issue of Jerusalem, Mr. Netanyahu was deftly ambiguous: "Jerusalem, the capital of Israel, must remain undivided, with continued religious freedom for all faiths." That does not seem to exclude Palestinian de facto control over certain parts of Jerusalem and certainly over their holy places.

Finally, the prime minister expressed a clear and concrete vision of economic prosperity for Palestinians in partnership with Israel. Indeed, he stated that such economic prosperity can come even before a final peace agreement is reached.

"An economic peace is not a substitute for a political peace but an important element in achieving it. Together we can undertake projects that overcome the scarcities of our region, like water desalination, or maximize its advantages, like developing solar energy, and exploiting our geographic location by laying gas and petroleum lines and establishing transportation links between Asia, Africa and Europe. ...

"Together we can develop industrial areas that will generate thousands of jobs and develop tourist sites that will attract millions of visitors eager to walk in the footsteps of history - in Nazareth and in Bethlehem, around the walls of Jericho and the walls of Jerusalem, on the banks of the Sea of Galilee, and the baptismal site on the banks of the Jordan."

Who cannot be moved by these words? Perhaps Mr. Netanyahu has it right - a new sequencing of the peace process: First, economic partnership and prosperity between Israelis and Palestinians; and then peace, not the other way around.

It could not have been by accident that Mr. Netanyahu chose to deliver his remarkable speech at the Begin-Sadat Center at Bar-Ilan University. It was slightly more than 30 years ago, on March 26, 1979, that Prime Minister Menachem Begin, as the leader of the right-wing Likud or "Consolidation" Party, joined with Egyptian President Anwar Sadat and signed a historic peace agreement between Israel and Egypt

Now another man of the right, another Likud prime minister some three decades later, seems poised to make the lasting peace between Israel and Palestinians that has so long eluded his predecessors.

One wonders whether Mr. Netanyahu might also be thinking: If Richard Nixon could go to China because of a base on the right that trusted him, then I can bring peace and prosperity between Israelis and Palestinians.

Let's hope - and pray - that he is right.

Hi Peggy,

My name is Tommy Vietor and I handle foreign policy issues out of the White House press office. We met briefly at George Will's house when the President visited a few months back.

I'm writing to strenuously object to your portrayal of Secretary Clinton in today's column. First, a little background about me. I spent the better part of my time on the Obama campaign working to defeat then Senator Clinton, so I'm no apologist or Hillaryland loyalist. But to be frank, in the first 6 months of this administration she has more than won me and the vast majority of this White House over with her tireless work.

The truth is that Secretary Clinton has been leading the administration's foreign policy on a host of critical issues, including the most recent crisis in Honduras. Her visit to Russia laid the groundwork that allowed the President's trip to Russia to be such a success. Her visit to the Hague led to an increase in foreign assistance – the list goes on and on. Moreover, she and the President have developed a very close working relationship. She's at the WH nearly every day of the week, either meeting one-on-one with the President, joining him at meetings with foreign heads of state, or slogging out policy decisions in the Situation Room in principles committee meetings. The fact that she has hired strong envoys like Holbrooke and Mitchell to focus day in and day out on specific regional issues just further demonstrates her strength. She has the confidence in her role to hire big personalities, and she doesn't care if they're the ones quoted in the paper as long as we're making progress.

But still the going conventional wisdom seems to be that a Secretary of State's worth can be measured in Nexis hits. But to be frank, she can do far more to influence policy in the White House Situation Room than in Wolf Blitzer's. And her star power abroad, as evident by her rock star treatment on shows like "Good Morning Manila" helps America's reputation abroad in ways that cannot be quantified.

Yes, it's true that she didn't attend the G-8 or the Russia trip, but that has nothing to do with the President not wanting her in the room. In fact, everyone was very disappointed that she couldn't come because she adds so much value. But the truth is that a shoulder shattering your elbow at age 62 is incredibly painful and requires recover time. I dislocated my shoulder late last week, and the idea of having to endure an international flight and a summit on international finance would be unbearable, and I'm in my late 20s.

Maybe I'm just naïve, but I do hope that at some point the relationship between President Obama and Secretary Clinton will no longer be viewed on purely adversarial and political terms. The notion that she has been shelved or sidelined

because you see the President also speaking about foreign policy makes no sense. Of course you're going to see the President out in front talking about these issues – that's part of his job, and it's also the reality of having the nuclear codes at your disposal. But the President asked Secretary Clinton to serve as Secretary of State because he believed she is a person of extraordinary talent and intelligence with almost unlimited potential to influence opinion of the United States abroad and further US interests. She has been extremely successful, and anyone who works in this building on foreign policy (ie – people that Tina Brown has never spoken to) will tell you that there is no one who walks into this building with more influence.

Anyway, thanks for reading and writing. I truly enjoy reading your columns, even if I don't always agree.
